# Edward Turgeon, piano Anne Louise-Turgeon, piano



DUO TURGEON – Anne Louise-Turgeon and Edward Turgeon have been performing together since 1988. They met while studying at the University of Toronto, receiving their Bachelor of Music Degrees in 1989. They continued their education at the Yale University

School of Music receiving their Master of Music (1993), Master of Musical Arts (1994), and Doctor of Musical Arts (2000) Degrees. Anne's teachers have included Marietta Orlov, Mark Jablonski, and Boris Berman, while Edward studied with James Anagnoson and Peter Frankl. They are First Prize winners in both the Ninth International Schubert Competition for Piano Duos in 1995 and the Sixth Murray Dranoff International in Miami in 1997. As educators, the Turgeons have held positions at Algoma University College, Mount Holyoke College, Royal Conservatory College of Piano Examiners, and Harid Conservatory. Currently, they are on the faculty of Florida Atlantic University's Boca Raton campus.
