Mark Morton

Mark Morton is principal bass of the Columbus Symphony Orchestra, is the first-prize winner of the International Society of Bassists Solo Competition in New York City.

A busy recitalist and concerto performer, Morton has been a featured double bass soloist on radio and television broadcasts including NPR's "Performance Today". He shares a compact disc with world-renowned bassist Gary Karr of solo double bass music by Paul Ramsier on Albany Records. It was with that disc that Classical CD Reviews hailed him as "a most artistic representative of the new generation developed in the last half century." He has also released two other solo CDs: Thresholds, and Russian Rendezvous - the first two volumes of the Solo Double Bass Repertoire on Basso Profóndo Records.

Teaching Experience

Dr. Morton is active in teaching, with an appointment as artist faculty - bass at the Lynn University Conservatory School of Music. Before Lynn University, Morton was the assistant double bass instructor to Gary Karr at The Hartt School of Music, and bass professor at Capital University. In addition to the "Dr. Morton" series of books on the art of bass playing, Mark has had many articles appear in Strings, Bass World, and American String Teacher magazines, as well the New Grove Dictionary of Music and Musicians.

Mark Morton is also the Artistic Director of the American School of Double Bass, housed in a century-old restored firehouse. The American School of Double Bass draws students, teachers, and professionals from all over the United States to its summer camps, private lessons, workshops and master classes.

Education

An accomplished pianist, Morton began his musical studies both the double bass and piano. By the age of seventeen he had performed as piano soloist with several orchestras including the Houston Symphony Orchestra. He then focused his musical energies on the double bass, earning the undergraduate and graduate degrees from the Juilliard School in New York. He subsequently went on to be only the second bassist to receive the Doctor of Musical Arts degree in the history of that institution.

Yang Shen

Pianist Yang Shen has given concerts and recitals in Asia, North America, Europe and Israel to critical accolades.

Ms. Shen has been awarded top prizes in numerous competitions including The National Society of Arts and Letters Piano Competition, Josef Hoffman International Piano Competition, Los Angeles Liszt Piano Competition, Carmel International Music Competition amongst others.

She has also been invited to participate in some of the most prestigious piano events in the world including The Arthur Rubinstein International Piano Master Competition, The Leeds International Piano Competition, and she was a semi-finalist in The 2004 Sydney International Piano Competition in Australia. Most Recently, Ms. Shen is invited to the screen audition for the twelfth Van Cliburn International Piano Competition in Fort Worth in 2005.

In 2002, Ms. Shen attended the Aspen Music Festival as a recipient of the prestigious New Horizon Fellowship; she has also participated in the Pianofest in the Hamptons and The Music Academy of the West in Santa Barbara with full scholarships.

Teaching Experience

Dr. Shen is an adjunct faculty at the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University.

Education

Dr. Shen earned her Doctoral of Musical Arts degree at University of Southern California, where she also received her Master of Music degree, studying with the renowned pedagogue John Perry. While there, Ms. Shen served as Piano Studio Assistant teaching students ranging from Bachelor to Doctoral programs. Prior to moving to California, she graduated Suma cum Laude from The Conservatory of Music at Lynn University with a Bachelor of Music degree as a student of Roberta Rust. Her other prominent piano teachers have included Jerome Lowenthal and Arie Vardi.


