Marc Reese, trumpet, is best known for his internationally acclaimed near two decade tenure with the Empire Brass. He has also performed with the New York Philharmonic, Cleveland and Boston Symphony Orchestras. Mr. Reese has numerous recordings on Telarc, Sony and Naxos. As an educator, Mr. Reese serves as Assistant Dean and Brass Department Head for the Lynn University Conservatory of Music. He received his Bachelor of Music degree from Boston University and Master of Music degree from the New England Conservatory. This is Mr. Reese's seventh season with the Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival.

## **GUEST ARTISTS**

Rebecca Diderrich, viola, a native of London ON Canada, completed two ARCT performance diplomas with the Royal Conservatory of Toronto as a pianist and violinist. She holds a Bachelor of Music Performance degree from the University of Toronto where she studied the violin with Lorand Fenyves, and a Professional Performance Certificate from Lynn University where she studied the viola with Ralph Fielding. Ms. Diderrich is the Principal Violist of the Southwest Florida Symphony Orchestra, as well as a violist with the Palm Beach Opera Orchestra and the Florida Grand Opera Orchestra. She has been a regular guest performer with the Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival since 2006.

Erika Yamada, oboe, was born in Kyoto, Japan and grew up in the New Orleans area where her family moved when she was five. She is a graduate of the Eastman School of Music where she studied with Richard Killmer and received a Bachelor of Music degree in performance and the Performer's Certificate. She was a member of the Florida Philharmonic and the Florida Grand Opera orchestras and has played principal oboe with the Miami Chamber Symphony, Orchestra Miami, the Miami City Ballet, the Atlantic Classical Orchestra, the Boca Raton Symphonia, and the Shinsei Symphony Orchestra in Tokyo, Japan. She has served on the faculties of the University of Miami, New World School of the Arts, Broward Community College, and S.U.N.Y. at Geneseo and is a panelist for the National Foundation for Advancement in the Arts.

GUEST ARTISTS Oboe: Erika Yamada Viola: Rebecca Diderrich Susan Moyer Bergeron, DMA, cello, has just completed her sixth season with the Naples Philharmonic Orchestra. The Lancaster, PA native has called South Florida her home for over twenty years, playing at times with most of the musical ensembles in the area, notably the New World Symphony, the Florida Philharmonic, Palm Beach Opera, Boca Raton Symphonia, Atlantic Classical Orchestra and the Southwest Florida Symphony to name a few. Susan studied at the New England Conservatory (Bachelors), the University of Akron (Masters) and the University of Miami (Doctorate of Musical Arts). Dr. Bergeron has been with the Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival for fifteen seasons and appears on five Chamber Music Palm Beach CDs on the Klavier Music Production label.

Karen Fuller Dixon, *flute*, is Principal Flute of the Palm Beach Opera Orchestra and is the newly appointed Principal Flute of the Opus One Orchestra (Miami City Ballet). She also performs with the Boca Raton Symphonia, the Atlantic Classical Orchestra and Orchestra Miami, and coaches chamber music at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music in Boca Raton. Ms. Dixon received both her Bachelors and Masters degrees in Flute Performance from the Manhattan School of Music. She is on the Board of Directors and is a founding member of the Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival, appearing on all six Chamber Music Palm Beach CDs on the Klavier Music Production label.

Michael Ellert, bassoon, is Principal Bassoon of the Palm Beach Opera Orchestra, Southwest Florida Symphony (Fort Myers), Boca Raton Symphonia and is the newly appointed Principal Bassoon of the Opus One Orchestra (Miami City Ballet). Mr. Ellert attended the Juilliard School and is currently the Assistant Professor of Bassoon, Head of the Woodwind Department and Chamber Music Coordinator at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music. He is on the Board of Directors and is a founding member of the Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival, appearing on all six Chamber Music Palm Beach CDs on the Klavier Music Production Label.

Michael Forte, *clarinet*, is Principal Clarinet of the Palm Beach Opera Orchestra and Southwest Florida Symphony (Fort Myers) and is the Co-Principal Clarinet of the Boca Raton Symphonia. He is a former member of the Maracaibo Symphony (Venezuela) and is a graduate of Syracuse University. Mr. Forte is on the Board of Directors and is a founding member of the Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival, appearing on all six Chamber Music Palm Beach CDs on the Klavier Music Production label.

Dina Kostic, violin, is a native of Belgrade, Serbia. She has held positions with the Florida Philharmonic, the New World Symphony and the Civic Orchestra of Chicago and currently performs regularly with various groups in South Florida including the Palm Beach Opera Orchestra, Boca Raton Symphonia, Atlantic Classical Orchestra and Seraphic Fire and as a substitute with the Naples Philharmonic and Sarasota Orchestras. Ms. Kostic has served as Adjunct Faculty at Barry University in Miami Shores since 2003, along with maintaining a private studio. She holds a Bachelors degree from Southern Methodist University and a Masters degree from Northwestern University. This year marks her eleventh season with the PBCMF and she appears on three of Chamber Music Palm Beach CDs on the Klavier Music Production label.

Lisa Leonard, piano, enjoys a diverse career as soloist, chamber musician, and educator. An active chamber musician she has performed with members of the Berlin, Vienna, New York, Cleveland and Cincinnati Symphonies and with members of the American and Mendelssohn String Quartets. Ms. Leonard received her Bachelor and Master of Music Degrees from the Manhattan School of Music and has served on the faculties of the North Carolina School of the Arts, the Meadowmount School of Music and the Las Vegas Music Festival and is currently the head of the Graduate Instrumental Collaborative Piano Program at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music. This year marks her tenth season with the Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival and appears on one Chamber Music Palm Beach CD on the Klavier Music Production Label.

Mei Mei Luo, violin, is recognized as one of South Florida's finest violinists. She was the Assistant Concertmaster of the Florida Philharmonic Orchestra and served as Concertmaster for the final performances in 2003. Ms. Luo is the founding first violinist of the acclaimed Delray String Quartet, is Concertmaster of Orchestra Miami, the Boca Raton Symphonia and the South Florida Philharmonic Orchestra and will be the Concertmaster for the Opus One Orchestra (Miami City Ballet) for the coming season. She has been a regular member of the Palm Beach Chamber Music Festival since 2000. Ms. Luo earned her Bachelors degree from the Shanghai Conservatory of Music and has her Masters from the University of Miami. She appears on four Chamber Music Palm Beach CDs on the Klavier Music Production label and has recorded with the Delray String Quartet on the Poinciana label, and also appears on the Harmonia Mundi label.
