Dr. Carl P. Ashley

Dr. Carl P. Ashley holds degrees from the University of Florida, Westminster Choir College, and the University of Miami. He is currently the Director of Choral Music at Saint Andrew's School, where he teaches grades six through twelve, and the Director of Choral Activities at Lynn University in Boca Raton, where he also teaches music history. He has conducted choruses at all levels and has taught at Westminster Choir College, Palm Beach Atlantic University, and the University of Miami. His choral groups receive top ratings at festivals and have performed throughout South Florida and at Carnegie Hall. In January, he will be conducting Vivaldi's *Gloria* in Odessa, Ukraine. His conducting teachers include Allen Crowell, John Dickson, Joseph Flummerfelt, Gary Green, John Grigsby, James Jordan, and Jo-Michael Scheibe.

Dr. Ashley has served as a church musician for nearly twenty years and most recently was the Minister of Music at Westside Baptist Church in Boynton Beach and the Director of Music and Worship Arts at Trinity United Methodist Church in Palm Beach Gardens. He has studied voice with Jana Young, Ronald Burrichter, and Marvin Keenze and has been seen on the opera stage with the Palm Beach Opera, the University of Miami Opera Theatre, the Florida Arts Celebration, and the Spoleto Festival of Two Worlds in the United States and Italy under the direction of Gian-Carlo Menotti. As a choral singer, Dr. Ashley has performed under the batons of Kurt Masur, Riccardo Muti, Robert Spano, and Joseph Flummerfelt. He is an active, award-winning composer and is published by National Music Publishers.

Dr. Ashley's memberships include the Music Educators National Conference (MENC); the American Choral Directors Association (ACDA); the Florida Music Educators Association (FMEA); the Florida Vocal Association (FVA); the Pi Kappa Lambda National Music Honor Society; the American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers (ASCAP); the International Federation for Choral Music (IFCM), and the ChoralNet Website Management Group (www.choralnet.org). He has appeared as a chorus member and baritone soloist on several labels, including Phillips and SoundByte.

He and his wife, Marie, a professional opera singer and voice teacher, live in Boynton Beach.
