

Chung Kim, violin

Beginning with the solo appearances with the Festival Orchestra at Lucerne Festival as the recipient of the Most Outstanding Violinist Award, Chung-Hyun Kim has been actively establishing herself as an emerging young violinist. Chung came to the United States from South Korea for music studies at the age of 14. She enrolled at the Idyllwild Arts Academy in California, where she studied with Todor Pelev and graduated as an honor student in 1999.

As a member of Idyllwild Academy's International Chamber Orchestra, Chung toured throughout the United States. Soon after she began leading the orchestra as the principal 2nd violinist at the age of 16, she was invited to perform at the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts at Washington DC with Maestro Leonardo Slatkin of the National Symphony. She also performed with the orchestra under the direction of Jung-Ho Park at the Hollywood Bowl in Los Angeles.

From 1997 to 1999, Chung was an active first violinist in chamber music ensembles and she performed at the Liszt Memorial Hall in Hungary, Golden Gate Auditorium in Seoul, Kresge Hall in Maine, as well as in Los Angeles, Aspen and New York. Chung has participated in the Liszt Music Festival, Aspen Music Festival, and Bowdoin Music Festival studying with Albert Markov, Naoko Tanaka, and Almita Vamos.

In 1999, Chung enrolled at the Lynn University Conservatory of Music as a student of artist faculty Sergiu Schwartz. Since coming to South Florida, Chung has performed with the Miami Symphony and the Hollywood Philharmonic. Currently a member of the President's Honor Society at Lynn University, Chung is completing her Bachelor of Music degree in Violin Performance with a minor in Business Administration.
