John Dee, Oboe

Principal oboe of the Florida Philharmonic Orchestra and Artist Faculty at the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University. Mr. Dee has tour ed the world as oboe soloist, clinician, lecturer, orchestral and chamber music oboist. He has recorded three internationally released solo CD's and has participated at most of the prestigueous music festivals throughout the world. A native of Chicago, Illinois, Mr. Dee has appeared and recorded with the Chicago Symphony Orchestra numerous times with such conductors as: Georg Solti, James Levine, Claudio Abbado and Carlo Maria Giulini.

Edward Turgeon, Piano

Dr. Turgeon enjoys a busy career as soloist, chamber musician, and pedagogue, having performed over five hundred concerts in North America and Europe. He has performed and/or toured with noted instrumentalists of our time, including artists such as Sidney Harth, James Campbell, Michael Rusinek, Ransom Wilson, and Laura Gilbert. As a member of the piano team "Duo Turgeon", with his wife Anne Louise-Turgeon, Edward has performed hundreds of concerts in some of the world's prestigious halls and festivals including the Concertgebouw of Amsterdam and Carnegie Hall to name a few. His prizes and awards include first prize in the International Schubert Competition for Piano Duos (Czech Republic, 1995) and first prize in the Murray

Dranoff International Two Piano Competition (Miami, 1997), the latter considered the largest and most respected duo piano competition in the world.

Shigeru Ishikawa, Bass

Principal Bass of the Florida Philharmonic and served as principal bass with the New Japan Phiharmonic in 1996 (Seiji Ozawa, music director) and the New World Symphony from 1993 to 1996. He has given numerous recitals in Japan and New York, including Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall in 1991 and Lincoln Center in 1992. He has been featured on WNCN Radio (New York).
