Artist Biographies

Violist **William Ford-Smith**, originally from Queens, NY, received his B.M. from The Eastman School of Music in 2014, where he studied under George Taylor (Associate Professor of Viola) and participated in the Honors Chamber Program with the Ying Quartet. Mr. Ford-Smith had the opportunity to perform chamber, solo and orchestral repertoire in Europe while attending the Assisi Summer Music Festival in 2014 and AIMS in Graz during the summers of 2016 and 2017. He recently won a section position with The Symphony of Westchester and has been a recurring substitute with the Binghamton Philharmonic and Brevard Symphony Orchestra. He is currently continuing his studies with Ralph Fielding at the Conservatory of Music at Lynn University and will receive a Professional Performance Certificate in 2019.

Praised for her "admirable technical finesse and expressive flair" (*Baltimore Sun*), pianist **Sheng-Yuan Kuan** has garnered enthusiastic receptions for her solo and chamber music performances at the Kennedy Center, Weill Recital Hall, Taiwan National Concert Hall, Musikverein in Vienna, and various music festivals and concert series throughout the US. Sheng-Yuan's collaborations with renowned musicians such as Nobuko Imai, Stefan Jackiw, Stephen Taylor, Espen Lilleslatten, Richard Stolzman, Keng-Yuen Tseng, Chad Hoopes, members of the Parker Quartet and Apollo Trio, Sir Angel Romero, Time for Three, and Latin Grammy Award winning flautist Nestor Torres, reflect her passion in making chamber music of eclectic styles.

Born in Taipei, Taiwan, Sheng-Yuan relocated to America to further her music education. She holds a D.M.A. degree from the <u>Peabody Conservatory</u>, M.M. degree from <u>Yale School of Music</u>, and B.M. degree from the <u>Manhattan School of Music</u>, studying with famous pedagogues like <u>Boris Slutsky</u>, <u>Peter Frankl</u>, <u>Scott McCarrey</u> and <u>Constance Keene</u>. She obtained awards at competitions worldwide, including the 13th Beethoven Piano Competition in Vienna (Best Female Pianist Award, 2009), the 12th Taipei Chopin International Piano Competition (3rd Prize, 2008), Corpus Christi International Competition in Texas (2nd Prize, 2008), New York Kosciuszko Chopin Piano Competition (3rd Prize, 2003), and BYU-Hawaii Concerto Competition (Winner, 2000). She was also the recipient of Honolulu Morning Music Club Scholarship, Peabody Institute of Music's Career Development Grant, Chamber Music Award and Accompanying Assistantship.

Currently a resident in south Florida, Sheng-Yuan performs regularly as a member of Con Brio Ensemble, <u>South Florida Chamber Ensemble</u>, <u>Scherzo Trio</u>, A's Duo, and <u>Femina Camera Trio</u>. She serves as piano faculty at the <u>Heifetz International Music Institute as well as staff</u> collaborative pianist and adjunct keyboard instructor at <u>Lynn University's Conservatory of Music</u> in Boca Raton, FL.
