"The 16 of us, 10 women and 6 men, ate, slept worked in the laboratory, read scientific texts or freud or novels or the newspaper, swam in the frigid ocean or in Echo Lake, climbed the mountains, photographed, sketched, painted, fished, attended summer opera, and finally, made love."
