Haley Family Biographies

P.R. Haley

Petrarch R. Haley (1802-1884) was born in Barren County, Kentucky, and later moved to Warren County, Illinois. He and his wife Sarah Jane McWhorter (1808-1890) traveled with Peter Butler to the Oregon Territory in 1853. He and his wife had nine children, one of whom, William Thompson Haley (1833-?) was in charge of the College Department of Monmouth University from 1857-1858, and later principal at Bethel College. He is buried in the Butler Davidson Cemetery.

William Thompson Haley

William Thompson Haley (1833-?) was the son of P.R and Sarah Haley. He came with his parents to the Oregon Territory in 1853, where he married Lucinda Miller Ford (1840-1867), the daughter of Nathaniel Ford, on July 22, 1858. He was a graduate of Bethany College in West Virginia, and later became the first President of the College Department of Monmouth University from 1857-1858, and subsequently the principal at Bethel College in Polk County, Oregon.
