

Georgia law requires at least one food service manager on staff to have successfully completed a food safety training program and passed an ANSI-

CFP exam. For all new establishments, there is a 90-day grace period to comply with the mandatory manager certification. During this 90-day period, the manager or person in charge must demonstrate food safety knowledge.

COLLEGE AND CAREER ADVISEMENT STRATEGIES FOR POST-SECONDARY COUNSELING PROFESSIONALS

The Georgia College Access Courses (GCAC) were developed through the Southern Regional Education Board's Go Alliance in cooperation with the College Access Challenge Grant (CACG) project.

Topics include: Developing strategies for creating college-going culture in the middle school grades, implementing strategies to engage middle grades students in career planning and academic achievement, guiding students to identify courses neded to prepare for high school, careers, and college and building transition activities for parents and students to help students prepare for high school.

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
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
