- 1. It was noted that Volumes I and II of the proceedings had been printed and distributed six weeks in advance of the conference. These volumes contain 211 contributed papers and 7 State-of-the-Art papers.
- 2. It was also noted that the reprint Volume III contained 36 papers, 2 State-of-the-Art papers, and 9 General Reports.
- The following subject was specifically discussed by the members:

Reducing the cost of the conference. Possible areas considered were: (1) reducing the number of themes, (2) producing the volumes in soft binding, (3) obtaining more exhibitors, (4) soliciting more funding through organizations, such as, the EPA, FHWA, etc.

- 4. It was suggested that discussion leaders be appointed to handle the discussion sessions, rather than the General Reporters. Discussion leaders may prepare a discussion which includes review of the papers they feel are most worthy of being discussed.
- It was recommended that the Fourth Case Histories Conference be organized definitely by the University of Missouri-Rolla in four or five years.
