





FINDING BOOKS in Reese Library

Use <u>GIL</u>, the library catalog, for finding books in Reese Library. A link to the catalog (GIL) is available on the <u>Reese Library Home Page</u>.

Search by subject headings to find sources on a subject:


- Careers as a broad term
- Attention as a broad term
- Or Attention Deficit Disorder as a Keyword (Title/Subject), to be a bit more specific.
   Library collection locations:

Electronic Indexes/Abstracts for Education (all resources listed here are part of the database offerings in GALILEO, Georgia's Virtual Library):

- <u>Academic Search Premier</u> (Ebsco) provides abstracts and indexing for over 3,800, as well as full text
  for over 3,200 scholarly journals and general magazines. <u>Research Library</u> provides abstracts and
  indexing for over 2,600, as well as full text for over 1,700 scholarly journals and general magazines.
  Both of these databases are linked directly from the GALILEO home page.
- The <u>ERIC</u> (Educational Resources Information Center) database covers all aspects of education and educational research, includes both abstracts of published and unpublished sources on thousands of educational topics. It corresponds to the printed indexes of RIE (Resources in Education) and CIJE (Current Index to Journals in Education). This database is produced by the Office Research and Improvement (OERI), U.S. Department of Education. The EbscoHOST Scientific, and AskERIC versions of the ERIC database include the searchable Thesaurus of ERIC Descriptors. Coverage: 1962 to the present Updates: Monthly.








#### IDENTIFYING ARTICLES in periodicals

- · We have article identification tools in two different formats:
- Paper indexes/abstracts (in the Reference Room)
- Electronic databases in <u>GALILEO</u>
- · Databases for Psychology:
  - PsycInfo and Psychological Abstracts. There are several different versions of the psychological database/print index produced by the American Psychological Association. The subject terminology of all of the print or electronic versions is governed by the Thesaurus of Psychological Index Terms 7th ed. (1994), found in the Reference Room.
  - Printed Index: Psychological Abstracts contains summaries of psychology and psychology-related English-language journal articles, technical reports, book chapters, and books; "ARRADIAGED by subject area for easy browsing. Cumulative author and subject indexes are published annually. Found in the reference stacks in the Reference Room on the first floor of Reese Library (REF BF1.P65).
  - <u>PsycINEQ</u> is the online counterpart to Psychological Abstracts, and is available through <u>Any</u> articles from psychology journals that are fulltext in <u>Ebsco</u> will also be full-text in this version of <u>PsycINEQ</u>. For more infomation from the American Psychological Association, consult: <u>PsycINEQ</u>: <u>Frequently Asked Questions</u>.
  - <u>PsycARTICLES</u> (also through <u>Ebsco</u>) covers general psychology and specialized basic, applied, clinical, and theoretical research in psychology. Over 25,000 full-text articles are available from 42 iournals published by American Psychological Association, Canadian

### Guides for specific courses

- Efficient—use materials you've used to prepare for the class session.
- Use other general materials you've prepared and link them to course guide.



### Guides for specific courses

- Help students determine extent of information needed.
- Explicit instructions help them learn the mechanics of information retrieval.

If you want to use an article from your textbook, use the GALILEO find cited article feature under Journals A to Z http://www.galileo.usg.edu/scholar/aug/journals/ to see if Reese Library has access to the electronic format. If not, check the Library catalog http://gil.aug.edu to look for a paper copy.

Examples for a few topics, from both GALILEO and GIL. GIL is the library catalog where you look for books on your topic. Look at the Finding Books tab on this guide to get tips for searching the catalog.

Company diversity/pluralism. In ABI Inform, try workplace diversity, advantages as a subject, and use the scholarly article limit. Then try workplace diversity. disadvantages.

GIL: Use exact subject Diversity in the workplace

Needed communication skills. In Wilson Business Full-text try business communication as a subject, and recessions or financial crisis as a subject. Then try searching one as a subject, and one as smart-text searching, and then switch them

GIL: Use exact subject Business communication

Historical changes in management or leadership styles: in Business Source Complete, try management styles or leadership styles or authoritarianism in any field, and history or social change as a subject.

GIL: Use exact search Management Employee participation, or Organizational Change, or Management by Objectives.

To find an electronic journal in our collection, enter the name of the journal in the Search for Periodical Titles box located below and click search. You have options to limit the search type by Contains, Begins With, or Exact Match. If we have a title in our collection, you will be presented with a list of different ways to access the journal, including the coverage dates.

Recommended journals for your paper are listed here. Those that are accessed through Academic Search Complete, Research Library and Wilson Omnifile databases are relatively simple to search. For the others, detailed instructions are provided below.

Police Practice and Research—indexed in Academic Search Complete
Crime and Delinquency—Sage; access through Electronic Journals by Title list
Policing—indexed in ProQuest Research Library

Policing: A Journal of Policy and Practice—Oxford University Press; access through Electronic Journals by Title list

Crime and Justice—indexed in LexisNexis Academic
Criminal Justice Review— indexed in Wilson Omnifile
International Journal of Police Science & Management—Academic Search Complete

For Crime and Delinquency, click on the Sage link which will take you to the publisher's site. Click in the 'search this journal' box and add your keywords, or use the advanced journal search to target different fields to search in. When you find an article, you may print, save or use the 'email article to a colleague' feature to email the article.
