## Friendly letters have 5 parts <br> From: http://www.abeteach.com/Writing/FLinfo.htm



1. The Heading: The heading can include your address and the date. In casual, friendly letters your address is not necessary.
2. The Salutation (greeting): This usually begins with Dear $\qquad$ . The blank is for the name of the person you are writing. After you write the person's name you put a comma (, ).
3. The Body: The body of the letter is the information you are writing in your letter. Indicate progress this week. Include :
a) topics studied,
b) an interesting fact that you learned,
c) one unanswered question that you still have.
d) Indicate if you are you working to the best of your ability and if not what can you do better next week?
e) State2 indicators of your success this week.
4. The Closing: In the closing the first word is capitalized and you put a comma after the last word. Ask parents for feedback to your letter/comments . Have them respond to you on the back of your letter.
5. Some examples of closings are: Sincerely, Your friend, Love, Very truly yours,
6. Your Signature: This is your name. It goes under the closing
