In Tuesday's general election which has historically served only to officially name and elect only nominees of the Democratic primary in this state, there was the usual interest of the voters as a reference to local politics was concerned.

On the national ticket, however, a heated campaign that has been waged in many sections of the United States was placed in the hands of the American voter on Tuesday with the decision going to the Republican party.

The choice of a First District congressman was between the Democratic nominee and incumbent, Congressman Prince H. Preston and Independent Harry P. Anderson. An overwhelming majority returned Mr. Preston to office to begin his second term as representative of the First Congressional District of Georgia.

On the basis of unofficial returns in the national election, President Eisenhower received 457 electoral votes and Democratic candidate Adlai Stevenson received 74 electoral votes.

The Statesboro Blue Devils shipped Swainsboro Tigers 12-7 at Mitchell Field in Swainsboro, Friday night. A homecoming crowd of 3,000 saw the Tigers topple from the unbeaten streak in Region 2-A with a 4-0 league record. The Blue Devils have virtually clinched the region by having only one 2-A game remaining with Sanderville at Sanderville on Friday night, November 16.

This Friday night, Statesboro will tangle with Baxley at Statesboro. Statesboro won the toss and elected to receive. Colby Cassidy and George Hagin started a drive from their own 40 to the Tiger's 45. A 16 yard pass to Johnny Deal set up the first score early in the first quarter. Cassidy crossed the goal line for a standing up. The try for the extra point failed. Swainsboro returned the line to tally the extra point. The Blue Devils started drive from their own 33 with George Hagin racing over 60 yards in two plays that put the ball on Statesboro's 4-yard line. Cassidy crossed the line to make it 12-7 at the end of the half.

The third quarter saw the Blue Devils stop a scoring threat when the Tigers put on a drive that brought the ball deep into the Statesboro territory. The last scoring threat by Statesboro was stopped when Duane Fulford intercepted a pass that was tossed from the Devil's 30. Cassidy tallied in rushing while George Hagin collected 37.
