SPRING FEVER DUE TO DIET DEFICIENCY

It is now time to begin to prevent that "tired feeling" in spring. Spring is the season of epidemics of children's diseases, pneumonia and bad colds. It is the season when the vitality of the majority of people is at its lowest ebb.

This condition in grandmother's days was known as "spring fever." It was thought to be a result of poisons which accumulated in the system during the winter. The newer knowledge of nutrition has taught that this condition is largely brought about by a poorly selected diet.

It is now known that it is possible to maintain a buoyant good health during the spring as well as other seasons of the year, and that this can be done by adding a generous quantity of fruits and vegetables to the customary diet of meats, eggs, potatoes, bread and syrup. A diet consisting largely of meats, bread, potatoes and sweets is deficient in both minerals and vitamins.

The general content of the diet is of great importance in the prevention of spring fever. Iodine, which constitutes only about one part in three million parts of the body, a quantity almost too small to detect, is of utmost importance in health.

When this substance is lacking, goitre results. Other minerals that are of very great importance in the diet are calcium, phosphorus and iron. Bones and teeth are composed largely of calcium and phosphorus. Iron is found chiefly in the blood.

These minerals must be present in certain proportions in the diet or health suffers. Phosphorus and calcium function only at their best when they bear a certain relationship to each other. Iron builds good red blood more efficiently when plenty of calcium is provided.

The requirement of the above minerals per man each day is as follows: Calcium, 0.69 grams; phosphorus, 1.32 grams and iron, 0.015 grams.

Very little had been done until recently to find out how nearly the diets of Georgia people approach the proper standards. In 1925 the Georgia Experiment Station, in cooperation with the Extension Division of the State College of Agriculture, began such a study.

Women in rural homes of the state have assisted by keeping a record of all foods consumed by their families for a period of two weeks during each of the four seasons of the year.

An analysis of these records is now being made. The records show that the rural people of Georgia are getting more calcium than either phosphorus or iron. There seems to be a decided lack of phosphorus and a very serious lack of iron in the diet.
