There have been some changes in the arrangement of our schools during the past year. The II grade is taught by Miss Hazel Hjelm in the basement of the Lutheran Church. The III grade is taught by Miss Jennie Rugan in the school building on the hill. Mr. Axel Tall has the VI grade and part of the V grade, and Miss Vera Peterson teaches the IV grade and the remainder of the V.

The basement of the Lutheran Church has proved to be a very satisfactory substitute for a school building.

The bills for school maintenance have been figured up to the same date in the year as last year's settlement, so the amount estimated and appropriated at last year's town meeting was sufficient.

In considering the financial forecast for the coming year the committee would suggest the same amount of appropriation as last year, \$3500.00.

There are no indications that there will be a smaller number of pupils in town next year, and the school rooms are already filled to the limit, so we shall need the same number of teachers. Other expenses will be about the same.

At the opening of the fall term we were obliged to buy new seats for the II Grade. As there was no appropriation for that purpose there is a bill of \$254.00 on hand which will need to be settled.

WARRANT

Greeting:

ART. 6—To choose a treasurer for the ensuing year.

ART. 7—To choose constables for the ensuing year.

ART. 8—To choose a road commissioner for the ensuing year.

ART. 9—To choose ballot clerks for the ensuing year.

ART. 10—To choose a town auditor for the ensuing year.

ART. 11—To choose a fire inspector for the ensuing year.

ART. 12—To choose a fire chief for Stockholm fire department for the ensuing year.

ART. 13—To choose all other necessary town officers for the ensuing year.

ART. 14—To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of fifty dollars for the Anti-Tuberculosis Association.

ART. 15—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for street lights for the ensuing year and school house lights.

ART. 16—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the support of the poor for the ensuing year.

ART. 17—To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of fifty dollars for 50-50 road machine work.

ART. 18—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for repair of highways, bridges, winter work and State Aid patrol maintenance.

ART. 19—To see what action the town will take in regards to fixing the amount of bonds for:

Treasurer of School Fund, Town Treasurer, Tax Collector, Excise Tax Collector or any other town officers.

ART. 20—To see what action the town will take in regards to renting a town office and fire station, and how much money will be raised for same.

ART. 21—To see what salaries the different town officers shall be paid and how much money will be raised for same.

ART. 22—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for health department and health officer.

ART. 23—To see if the town will authorize the selectmen and town treasurer to execute and negotiate town of Stockholm notes for a sum not greater than \$8,000.00 and to be paid during the current year by taxation, bearing interest at a rate not greater than 6 per cent to be used to defray town charges in anticipation of the collection of taxes.

ART. 24—To see if the town will vote to accept section of State Aid road as recommended by selectmen and state supervisor, being a continuation of work of 1934, and running in an easterly direction towards New Sweden line.

ART. 25—To see if the town will grant and raise the sum of \$1,849.50 to pay new school house bond due 1934.

ART. 26—To see what sum of money the town

will grant and raise for interest on school house bond.

ART. 27—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Memorial Day to be expended by the Perkins Post, American Legion.

ART. 28—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for Mother's Aid, dependent soldiers and children in state custody.

ART. 29—To see if the town will vote "Yes" or "No" on the question of appropriating and raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Sec. 20, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of 1930.

ART. 30—To see what sum the town will appropriate and raise for improvement of the section of State Aid road as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission (in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways and bridges) under the provisions of Sec. 19, Chap. 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Sec. 3, Chap. 175, Public Laws of 1933.

ART. 31—To see what sum, if any, the town would recommend to take from the joint state aid account for the purpose of applying bituminous surface treatment to state aid roads built within the past five years in accordance with the provisions of Chap. 271, P. L. 1931.

ART. 32—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for elementary and high schools, including teachers' services, conveyance, tuition

and text books, and school supplies for desk and laboratory use.

ART. 33—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for school repairs.

ART. 34—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for maintenance of Improved Third Class Highway.

ART. 35—To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of three hundred and nineteen dollars, (\$319.00) to pay for school house seats and shingles for school house.

ART. 36—To decide when the next annual town meeting will be held.

ART. 37—To see what sum of money the town will grant and raise for the contingent fund.

ART. 38—To see what time the taxes shall be legally due and payable and if any, what rate of interest to be charged on past due taxes.

ART. 39—To see if the town will vote to grant and raise the sum of two hundred fifty dollars, \$250.00, to pay for lot of land purchased from Atlas Plywood Corp., as a result of a special town meeting held in 1934.

ART. 40—To see what action the town will take in regards to the town farm.

ART. 41—To transact any other business that may come before the meeting.

The Selectmen give notice that they will be in session at the Eureka Club Hall from 8 until 10 A. M., March 18, 1935, for the purpose of correcting the list of voters.
