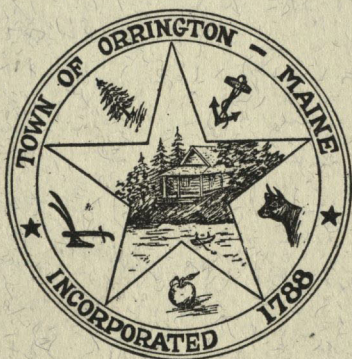

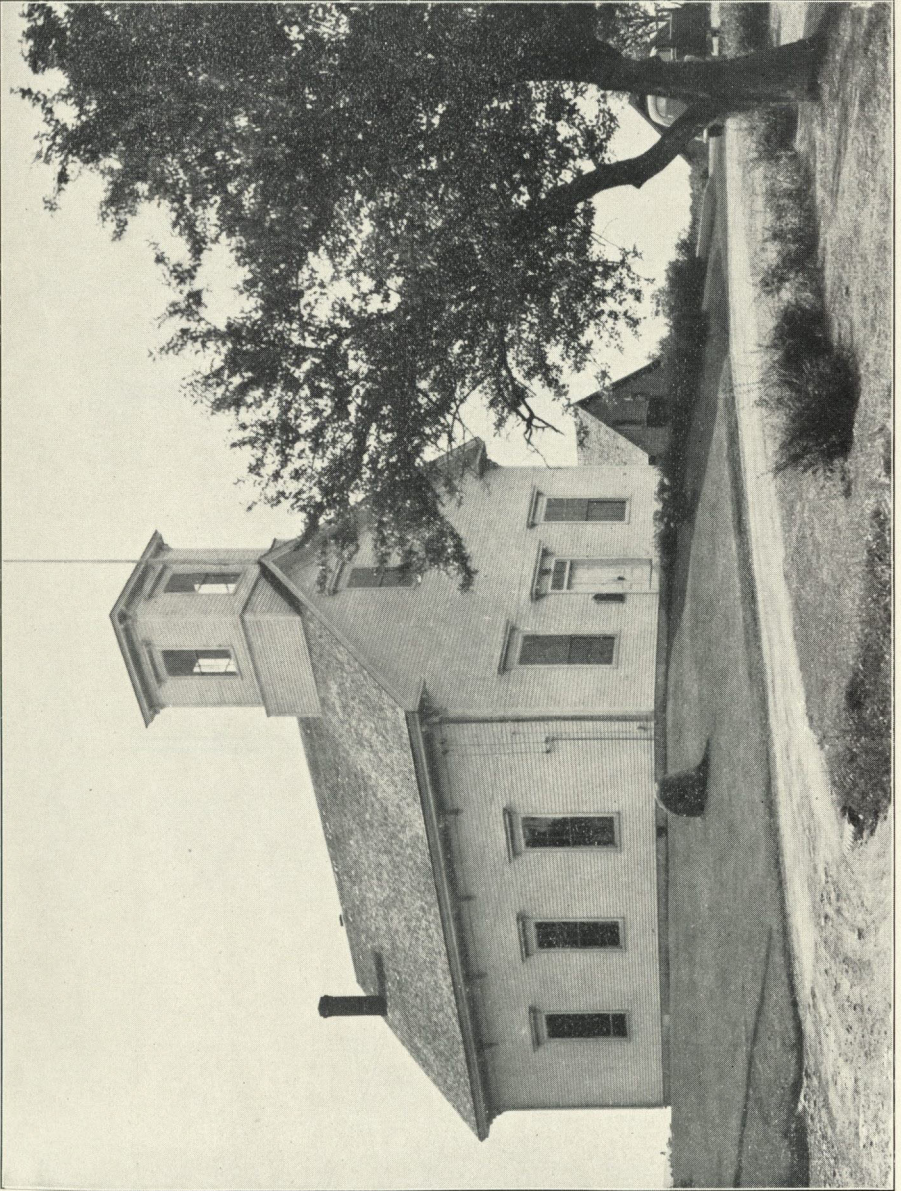

Warrant

To S. J. Williams, a Constable in the Town of Orrington,

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby required to notify and warn the inhabitants of the Town of Orrington qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to assemble at the Town House in said town on Monday, the thirteenth day of March next, at seven forty-five o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following:

Article 1. To elect a Moderator to preside at said meeting.

Art. 2. To elect by ballot, according to the provisions of Sections 38 to 52 inclusive, of Chap. 5, of the Revised Statutes of Maine, 1930, three Selectmen, who shall be Assessors and Overseers of the Poor, a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Road Commissioner, one member of the School Board for three years. The polls will be open for the election of these officers at eight o'clock in the forenoon and will close at twelve o'clock noon.

Art. 3. To see if the Town will accept the reports as submitted by the several town officers.

Art. 4. To choose all other town officers for the ensuing year.

Art. 5. To fix the compensation of the following town officers, for the ensuing year: Selectmen, Assessors, Overseers of the Poor, Treasurer, Collector of Taxes, Road Commissioner, Sealer of Weights and Measures, Health Officer, and others that may be deemed necessary.

Art. 6. To see if the Town will vote to elect or to have the Moderator appoint a Budget Committee, also to fix the number of members and their term of office.

Art. 7. To see if the Town will vote to grant and raise such sums of money as may be necessary to pay for:

Audit of Town Books.

Interest on School Fund.

Memorial Purposes.
 Miscellaneous Expenses.
 Mothers' Aid.
 Care of Cemeteries.
 Patrol Maintenance.
 Pay of Town Officers.
 Public Health Nurse.
 South Orrington Schoolhouse Note and Interest.
 Snow Removal.
 Support of Elementary Schools.
 Support of Secondary Schools.
 Support of Poor.
 Repair of School Property and Insurance.
 Repair of Town Buildings.
 Repair of Roads and Bridges.
 Use of Bangor Public Library, for one year.

Art. 8. To see if the Town, for the purpose of procuring a temporary loan or loans to and for the use of said Town in conducting its municipal business in the current municipal year of 1939 and in anticipation of and to be paid out of the taxes of the current municipal year of 1939, will authorize and direct the Town Treasurer, subject to the approval of the Selectmen, to borrow from time to time during said municipal year, a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate the sum of \$15,000.00 and to make, execute, and deliver negotiable note or notes of the Town therefor, payable within said current municipal year, and upon such terms as shall be satisfactory to said Treasurer and Selectmen, any debt or debts incurred hereunder to be paid out of money raised by taxation during the present municipal year.

Art. 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise the sum of \$558.00 for the maintenance of improved sections of Third Class highways in accordance with provisions of Secs. 4 and 5 of Chap. 173, Public Laws of 1935.

Art. 10. To see what sum the Town will raise or appropriate for State Aid Road Construction, in addition to the amounts regularly raised for the care of ways, highways, and bridges, under the provisions of Sec. 19, Chapter 28, Revised Statutes of 1930, or under the provisions of Sec. 3, Chapter 229, Public Laws of 1937.

Art. 11. To see if the Town will authorize the Assessors and Tax Collector to offer a discount for prompt payment of taxes and

collect interest on deferred payment of same, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 12. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen or Treasurer in behalf of the Town, to sell and dispose of any real estate acquired by the Town for non-payment of taxes thereon, on such terms as they deem advisable, and to execute quitclaim deeds for such property.

Art. 13. To see what sum, if any, the Town will recommend to take from the joint State Aid account for the purpose of building Red Bridge, so called, on the road from East Orrington to Brewer Lake or take any other action thereon.

Art. 14. By request, to see if the Town will vote to grant and raise, or appropriate from the general road account, the sum of \$100.00 for the improvement of the road leading from the corner near the home of Will B. Smith to the Oak Hill Cemetery, or take any other action thereon.

Art. 15. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to grant and raise, to be expended and used for advertising the natural resources, advantages and attractions of the State of Maine.

Art. 16. By request, to see if the Town will vote to raise, or appropriate from the general road account, a sum of money sufficient for the purchase of a sander.

Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to accept from Alice G. Freeman the sum of \$100.00, the interest for same to be used for the perpetual care of the Charles H. Freeman lot in Oak Hill Cemetery.

Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to recommend the abatement of uncollected poll and personal taxes for the years 1929, 1930, 1931, 1932, and 1933, which in the opinion of the Assessors are uncollectable.

Art. 19. To act on any other question that may legally come before said meeting.

The Selectmen will be in session at the Town Hall from nine o'clock in the forenoon until four o'clock in the afternoon on Saturday, March 11, 1939, for the purpose of revising the list of voters.

Ninety-two students entered secondary schools in September, which was an increase over any previous year. The increased cost of tuition at Brewer and the extra number of students attending different schools made the total cost of tuition for the year \$980 more than was anticipated at the time of making out the budget. The cost of tuition for the next municipal year will be approximately \$7,000, providing the same per cent of eligible students remain in school. The State Fund for tuition is \$700, leaving the balance to be appropriated at the annual meeting.

After fifteen years of teaching in Orrington, Miss Dagny Erickson resigned to accept a better position in Brewer. Her resignation was accepted with regret for her work in Orrington was very successful. Miss Evangeline Farnham succeeded her. Miss Farnham graduated from Aroostook State Normal School, and after some experience returned as a teacher in the Training School. For the two years before coming to Orrington she taught in the grammar school at Wellesley, Mass.

REPAIRS

Through the cooperation of the Selectmen, we were able to have the North, Center, and Burns Memorial school buildings painted at a very small expense. One side of the roof at the Center needs to be shingled. The other buildings are in excellent condition.

The bus has been in use for ten years and is now giving some trouble. It seems almost necessary to trade it within a year, otherwise considerable expense will be incurred, also a possible loss of time for the children.

May I again express to the citizens, officials and teachers my sincere appreciation for their cooperation.

Auditor's Report

March 4, 1939.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Orrington, Maine:

This is to certify that I have audited the accounts of your Selectmen, Treasurer, and Collector for the municipal year ended February 15, 1939. The cash balance of your Treasurer was reconciled, as well as the uncollected tax balance.

The schedules submitted herewith are taken from your town records and, to the best of my knowledge and belief, reflect the financial condition of your town.

Referring to the Comparative Balance Sheet, you will note that the 1938 Tax Deeds and the 1937 and prior Tax Deeds and Liens together with property taken over by the town acquired through the non-payment of taxes is \$13,563.84. This shows an approximate increase over last year of \$1,500.00. This condition of a steady increase of Deeds and Liens has been going on for some time. Unless a better collection of taxes, deeds, and liens is made it will be more difficult for the town to maintain its surplus and continue payment of its bills.

The Item, "Ministerial School Fund," under the Liabilities in the above schedule is the School Grant that was spent by the town years ago, on which you have been raising six per cent. interest and crediting it to the Elementary School account. This has always been a liability of the town and as such must be shown. The town also should raise and appropriate this money at some time, as it should be carried in the same manner as the Cemetery Trust Funds or the Burns Fund.

You will also please note that the uncollected tax balances, in some instances, are greater than last year. This is due to over payments by the Collector and the amounts as shown in this schedule are according to the Tax Collector's record of unpaid balances, as per printed list in the Tax Collector's report.

Under the schedule Unexpended and Overdraft Balances, please note the amount of overdraft in the Poor Relief account. It is, of course, impossible at the time monies are appropriated to determine the exact amount necessary for this account, but it would seem that a closer balance could and should be maintained.

In the schedule showing the Proof of Change in Surplus, the three amounts appropriated for the 150th Anniversary, Audit of

Town Books, and Advertising of State, totaling \$600.00, was a direct deduction from Surplus. A continuation of this practice of appropriating instead of raising money for any item may very easily change the financial condition of the town from a surplus to a net debt. Until such a time as the town has a good sized bank balance and a large surplus, all money should be raised and not appropriated.

I wish to take this opportunity of thanking your town officials for their fine cooperation during the audit.

Hancock County Health Service

To the Citizens of the Town of Orrington, Maine:

Herein is a brief report of services rendered the Town of Orrington, Maine, by the Hancock County Health Service, February 1, 1938—February 1, 1939.

The schools of Orrington, North, South, East, and Center districts were visited and given classroom inspection during the months of March, April, May, June, September, October, November, and December, and a check-up was made of the Seven Point pupils. Individual inspection was given the pupils absent at the time of the 1937 annual inspection.

Visited the schools in April at the request of the selectmen and inspected all heads for pediculosis, and for skin rashes. One pupil was found with a skin rash which looked rather suspicious. Conveyed the young girl to Dr. Todd's office in Brewer who examined and diagnosed the case as scabies. The child was excluded from school until thoroughly recovered, thus preventing a spread of the disease.

The Early Diagnosis Tuberculosis Campaign material in the form of pamphlets and posters was distributed in each room of all schools visited. Also placed some in public places. This coming spring we hope to have a tuberculin test clinic, and all pupils, whose parents will sign the consent slips, will have the test, later to be followed by having all reactors X-rayed.

The annual physical inspection has been given all pupils of the schools of Orrington, the North Primary and Grammar during the month of September, the East Primary and Grammar in November, the Blanche K. Blake or South Orrington Primary, Intermediate and Grammar and the center districts during January, and consisted of the usual routine of weighing and measuring, the Snellen's test for vision, the whisper test for hearing, inspection of the teeth, throat, head, scalp for skin rashes and sores, postural defects, personal cleanliness and for symptoms of infectious diseases. The result of which and number of defects are as follows:

Of the 237 pupils inspected, 178 were found with defects, and 59 eligible to qualify for the Seven Point pin and certificate.

Of the 131 having decayed teeth, 90 have decay of the temporary, and 71 decay of the permanent, while 25 need prophylactic cleaning—a very little improvement over the previous years.

As a result of previous inspections, and through the follow-up visits, and the sending of the notification slips to the parents stating the defects found, the following defects have been corrected: 53 dental, 8 vision, 9 tonsils and adenoids (corrected by operation), 2 hearing, 2 skin, and 3 scalp conditions.

A few years ago the Parent Teachers Association sponsored and financed a dental reparative clinic for pupils of the Orrington schools, and much benefit was derived from it. We earnestly hope it may be repeated, for the decayed teeth seem to be our greatest problem in the schools of today. Let us make it our object, "Better Health and More Happiness through better mouths," for every child in Orrington.

The service rendered the many towns of Hancock County, as well as Orrington is financed through the sale of the Christmas Seals, and by the town appropriation, for which we wish to express our sincere thanks and appreciation to all the splendid citizens, who have made this work possible.
