COLONEL THURLOW REED DUNNING, SR.

Thurlow Reed Dunning was born in Freeport, Maine on September 21, 1897, the second youngest of the seven children of Benjamin F. and Adriann (Reed) Dunning. Benjamin Franklin Dunning, "Frank" to family and friends alike, was a mason by trade. He was the head mason during the construction of Casco Castle. The castle burned in 1914 but is survived by the Castle tower which has become an area landmark.

Thurlow spent his early years in Freeport and moved with his family to Winchester, Massachusetts when he was 10 years old. The family was deeply rooted in Freeport and eventually he returned here as did many members of his family.

He married Gertrude Fransen who died shortly after the birth of their son, Robert. On September 16, 1922 he married Ethel Sumner Benson in Somerville, Massachusetts. They had five children, Jesse, Mary Jane, Carol, Thurlow Jr. and Alice.

He served with distinction in the United States Army in World War I (26th "Yankee" Division) and World War II (211th F. A. Battalion) and was awarded five battle stars for his service in World War I and the Bronze Star for meritorious service in World War II. Between World War I and World War II he served continuously with the Massachusetts National Guard.

After his service in World War II he accepted employment which brought him back to Maine and made it possible for him to settle again in Freeport.

His life long interest in the history of this country, of communities and of people seemed to lead naturally to an avid interest in Genealogy. Upon his return to Freeport he began gathering information on the early families of Freeport including that of the Dunning family. When he retired he devoted many hours to researching the genealogies of these families.

Family, including grandchildren were enlisted to help on many occasions. He was instrumental in reactivating the Freeport Historical Society which had been dormant for many years.

He was a firm, quiet, reserved and proud man who, through his example, earned the love and respect of his family and friends. He always let us know he was proud of us. We certainly are proud of him.

He died on July 11, 1974.

I am honored to provide this biographical data about my father, Colonel Thurlow Reed Dunning, Sr.

- 1 John Davis, was among the followers of Rev. Richard Blyman who came to this country in 1640, to be the first pastor of Marblehead, Mass. John Davis had two brothers William, who went to Roxbury and another who went to Barnstable, Mass. They were Welsh gentlemen of good note. John Davis followed the Rev. Blyman to Gloucester, Mass. after the colony at Marblehead broke up, in 1641. He was married twice: (1) Alice ; (2) Frances
After a few years he went to Ipswich, leaving sons, Jacob and James in Gloucester.
- 2 Isaac Davis, b. , was apparently indentured and he was fined 3 pounds in 1655 for running away from his master. His father undertook to pay the fine. Isaac m., in Beverly, 9/28/1659, Lydia Black, b. Beverly, 6/3/1635, d/o John Black. In 1677, Isaac took the oath of Allegiance in Beverly. He was an early settler of Casco Bay in Maine. In 1680, he witnessed a deed (George Felt) and worked for Robert Lawrence. In 1687, He and his son-in-law, Richard Smith, and others, petitioned Andros for land grants. This was done after he removed from Falmouth to the Kennebec with sons John and Ebenezer. Isaac lived on a large farm (400 acres), at Stroudwater north of Long Creek. but he had a house on his lot in the village on the neck. It is not known when he came here but he was here when Pres. Danforth came here in 1600 to resettle the town. Isaac and his wife were probably victims of the Indians.

This was in payment for notes signed by Samuel Davis as bond for David Hannaford which David was forced to make good. Mary Edwards, a granddaughter could remember being told as a child, that the oxen had to be sold and also a piece of land to pay off the notes.

Samuel Davis was a veteran of the War of 1812

He and his wife lived in the house given him by his aunt Susannah Edes of Beech Hill, this was the old homestead.

1 Edward Dillingham, son of Rev. Henry and Oseth Dillingham, bpt. 1595, at Cottesback, Leicestershire, Eng., m., 1614, Ursular (Dusilla) Carter.

They had 7 children, three of whom came to America with him, Oseth, Henry and John.

He came over on the ship "William Francis", arriving in Boston in 1632, he settled in Lynn.

One of "ten men of Saugust" (Lynn was called Saugus at that time) to receive large grants of land at Cape Cod.

He helped to found the town of Sandwich.

2 Henry Dillingham, bpt. at Cottesback, Leicestershire, Eng., 10/13/1624. He d. in Sandwich, Mass. 7/26/1705.

He came to America in 1632 with his father and moved with him from Lynn to Sandwich in 1637, where he passed the remainder of his life.

He appears on a list of men able to bear arms in 1643.

He m., 6/24/1652, Hannah Perry, who d. 6/9/1673.

He adopted the Quaker faith and suffered persecution with others of that sect. On 6/7/1659 he was fined 50 shillings "for refusing to serve in the office of constable, being chosen by the town of Sandwich", and again fined 2 pounds, 10 shillings for again refusing.

He and his wife were again fined in 1660. Later, in 1660, he served as constable, which shows that either he had given in or that the town had ceased to bother him so much. He still, however, was of the Quaker faith.

In 2/24/1652, he was one of the "Juriers to lay out the convenient way from Sandwich to Plymouth".

In 1658 he appears as a land owner; in 1652 he took the oath of Fidelity; in 1667, with his brother John, settled his father's estate; in 1670 he was one of the Grand Jury; in 1675 he appears on the list of "towns-men" of Sandwich and was "voted to become one of the Council of War from that town".

In June, 1689, he was admitted freeman. As it was necessary for this, that he should have complied with all the civil and religious requirements, it indicates that he had made his peace with the Authorities and also that the persecution of the Quakers had been modified or abandoned.

His name is found on a list of freemen in 1701 and 1702. Mrs. A.R.W. French says in "An American Ancestry", "Henry 2 Dillingham, son of Edward 1, was b. about 1627. He had eight children, of whom only the name of Dorcas who m. Ralph Earle in 1692, and Edward have been preserved." The birth of but 5 are recorded in the Sandwich records, and only these same 5 are mentioned in their father's will. An inventory of Henry's will shows a value of 84 pounds, 16 shillings, 6 pence.

Edward Dillingham (Malatiah 4- John 3- Henry 2- Edward 1) b. abt. 1724 (No record of his birth has been found) (See under Ignatius), d. 3/15/1812 in Freeport, Maine, m., 1751, Marcy Doty, of Scituate, Mass., d. 4/4/1812, d/o Samuel Doty and Mary Cobb. Burial place unknown.

The records of the Friends Society (Pembroke Monthly meeting) of 1783, contain this entry:- "Edward Dillingham is reported to have removed to Falmouth Monthly Meeting." Falmouth, now Portland, Maine was the meeting place of the Quakers from the surrounding towns, including Freeport, formerly No. Yarmouth, where most of Edward's descendents have lived since.

Some of his children were born in Hanover. It is said by descendents that Samuel, oldest son of Edward, came to Freeport with his father from Mass. and were blacksmiths and shod horses for the stage as it stopped in Freeport on the post road from Portland to Brunswick and beyond. Edward does not appear among the heads of family in the census of 1790, but it would seem, from the figures, that he was included in the family of his son Samuel of Freeport

He was a blacksmith by trade, as was his father.

In possession of one of his descendents in Freeport, is a curious and interesting old pitcher, probably made in England. On the front is his name, "Samuel Dillingham". On the side is a coat of arms over which is inscribed "The Blacksmith's Arms". Below is the motto "By hammer and hand all arts to stand". The crest is a phoenix and there is a coat of mail on either side. The shield contains three hammers surmounted by crowns, two above and one below the chevron.

In Edmondson's Heraldry, published in 1780, is found the following: "Blacksmiths Guild of London, Incorporated 15 April - 20 Eliz.- 1578 - by name of 'Blacksmiths and Spurriers Arms', a chevron or, between three hammers ~~are~~ handled of the second ducally of the last. Crest - on a wreath a mount vert; thereon a phoenix with wings indorced proper firing herself with the sun because of the last. Motto - "By hammer and hand all arts do stand". Ancient motto - "As God will, so be it". The arms confirmed and the crest altered by Sir William Segur, Garter, the 24th of June - 8 James I - 1660.

CAMPBELL

- 1 William Campbell of Campbelltown, Argyllshire, Scotland, was a member of the Monmouth rebellion. He escaped to Londonderry in 1685. He was a Lt. Col. in the forces of William of Orange at the siege of Londonderry.
- 2 Two of his sons, who were born in Ireland, James in 1690 and Samuel in 1695, came to Boston in 1735. In 1735 they moved to Londonderry, N.H. and later settled in Cherry Valley, N.Y.

1 Rev. Robert Dunlap, born in Barrilla, County Antrim, Ulster, Ireland. This was nine miles from Scotland, where his ancestors came from. He was born Aug., 1715 and died in Brunswick, Maine, 6/26/1775. He was son of John and Mary Dunlap. He had a very liberal education, earning his M.A. degree at an early age and then concentrating on Divinity.

Rev. Robert Dunlap entered the University of Edinboro, Scotland and began the study of Divinity at the age of 19. He gained a degree of Master of Arts and was at once licensed as a Presbyterian minister.

In the spring of 1736, he, with others, embarked for America. Their ship was wrecked on the Isle of Sables, 90 miles Southeast of Cape Breton. 96 of the 200 souls aboard perished. Robert Dunlap fastened their baby securely to it's mother and they were swept away by the waves. The wife and torn from him. Searching along the shore he found his wife and revived her but the baby was never found.

The survivors finally reached Canso Isle, about 120 miles from Halifax, where Gov. Shelly got them passage on a fishing vessel to Cape Ann, Mass.

From there he went to Boston, where he became acquainted with Rev. Mr. Morehead and Rev. Mr. McGregor, who were Presbyters of the Presbyterian Church.

He began his preaching at Dracut, Mass., being there for some time. From there he went to Nobleboro, Maine, labored at Boothbay, Sheepscot Bridge and Newcastle. He went to Brunswick early in 1746.

In 1747, Mr. Dunlap was ordained at the house of Rev. Andrew LeMercier, which was a small brick church on School St. in Boston. The Ordaining Presbytery was composed of Rev. Mr. LeMercier, of Boston, Rev. Mr. Morton, of Coleraine, N.H., Rev. Mr. Davidson, of Londonderry, N.H., Rev. Mr. Wilson and Rev. Mr. McLothlin.

Mr. Dunlap was the first settled minister in Brunswick, although there had been several who had preached there. He remained there for 13 years and resigned in Oct., 1760 over a dispute on the payment of his salary and the source of the money.

Robert Given and Vincent Woodside were a committee to go after him at Sheepscott, where he was preaching.

He was voted 4 pounds per Sabbath by the town during his probation. In March, 1748, the town voted to settle him at 200 pounds per year and a gift of 200 pounds when the war should be over. They voted to hire a house for his use for his use during the war and to pay the charges.

1754: The Proprietors deeded 150 acres to Mr. Dunlap.

1755: A meeting house was built at New Meadows.

1759: The town voted that the South-east part of the town was to have preaching every other Sunday.

Oct. 1760: A council, consisting of Rev. Mr. Smith, of Falmouth, Rev. Mr. Merrill, of Biddeford and Rev. Mr. Lorraine, dismissed Rev. Mr. Dunlap. (He was Presbyterian while they were Congregationalists.)

Letter to the Town of Brunswick:

"To the Town of Brunswick, June 30, 1760. Seeing it pleased Divine Providence to obstruct my being in Londonderry at the last sitting of the Presbytery, which will appear in my Journal & other evidence, if called; I, by advice of some worthy men; offer to ye consideration of these proposals -- 1st. That no mans money or Rates Shall ever Come as Ministerial Taxes In this town; that do not have my ministry. 2ndly. That such as be or may be adherents to my Ministry Have Liberty to pay there ministerial taxes & other Ecclesiastical Dues when Go to hear the word; or have or may join in connection with the old Church of Christ in Brunswick and such such as pretend any Scruple of Conscience in Joining with us. I Lord not over their Consciences; they may use their Christian Liberty; Their money shall be at their own disposal. I have always thought this was the best way to peace; tho't I would Rather quit my title to part of a town tax or Rate, than have a hand In Divisions; and uneasyness. I am no longer able to live under --.

2nd Proposition: Whether Deacon Hinkley & Capt David Dunning; as we have a Revd. and good Presbytery to go to; will continue their adherence, as I think we agreed and Signified and for which I am now preparing & still am Desirous of Such Government & Do profess to the west, --

3d; that whereas you are or ma Be acquainted with my going westward Twice. First, to ask Council tending to the Publick Benifit and Tranquility that unhappy divisions might be healed. Second, to wait on the Revd. P.B.Y. which wind and weather disappointed me. My Journal will demonstrate this. I therefore intreat you would let me have my arrears of last sallery. I have no minutes of the exact time when I accepted ye Call, But am pretty certain it was in March or April, after which I looked on myself yr minister, tho not really Ordained and went to Boston to prepare myself after which no pay was Rec'd by Me from any people for preaching the Gospel; as far as I can Remember; But came to Brunswick in the night of the eighth day of July which I am Ready to Depone. You may all see I am not wanting any Charges; only my Just Arears; Which will Satisfy & may possibly make us Easy. Sure I think I am at the Honest part.

Altho I spent my own money, about 30 pounds, Going to Boston & hiring a horse and riding to Derry when I was Ordained:-

And these last expenses; which I am sure is more & not less; of which I say nothing at this time"

Rev. Robert Dunlap, 1715 - 1775, m. Jane Allison, 1711 - 3/31/1797. Both are buried in the old Brunswick burying ground on the Mere Point road, opposite the Pleasant Hill road, Brunswick, Maine. Their original stones are still in place as well as some later ones, of marble, erected by descendents.

No stone is found for Andrew Dunning in any of the old
cemeteries, no doubt, because he was lost at sea.

DUNLAP of Topsham

That there should be another Robert Dunlap in the Brunswick area, who was, from all available records, not related in any close degree, was surely a remarkable coincidence. But it would seem to be true.

Robert Dunlap of Topsham came from Ireland prior to 1731. Thus he seems to be the earlier arrival of the two Roberts. He bought lot # 61 in 1731. His only son, John had lot #60 in 1738. Robert had two daughters.

Jane who married Daniel Eaton.

Margaret who married James Potter

There is little information on this family and like many other families, which bore the same name as another, their descendents become confused with one another.

The coincidence of first is another factor which is very confusing, as both families used the same first names for their children.

Of those names which have been unable to be placed, the following are some which may be of the Topsham family, as the dates place them in the area before it is possible for the family of Rev. Robert Dunlap to have been old enough.

1 Rev. Robert Dunlap, born in Barrilla, County Antrim, Ulster, Ireland. This was 9 miles from Scotland, where his ancestors came from. He was born August, 1715 and died in Brunswick, 6/26/1775. He was son of John and Mary Dunlap. He had a very liberal education, earning his M.A. degree at an early age and then concentrating on Divinity

Rev. Robert Dunlap entered the University of Edinboro, Scotland and began the study of Divinity at 19, gained a degree of Master of Arts and was at once licensed as a Presbyterian minister.

In the spring of 1736, he, with others, embarked for America. Their ship was wrecked on the Isle of Sablas, 90 miles Southeast of Cape Breton. 96 of the 200 souls aboard perished. Robert Dunlap fastened their baby securely to it's mother and they were swept away by the waves. The wife and child were torn away from him. Searching along the shore he found his wife and revived her but the baby was never found.

The survivors finally reached Canso Isle, about 120 miles from Halifax, where Gov. Shelly got them passage on a fishing vessel to Cape Ann, Mass.

From there he went to Boston, where he became acquainted with Rev. Mr. Morehead and Rev. Mr. McGregor, who were Presbyters of the Presbyterian Church.

He began his preaching at Dracut, Mass, being there for some time. From there he went to Nobleboro, Maine, labored at Boothbay, Sheepscott Bridge, and New Castle. He went to Brunswick early in 1746

In 1747, Mr. Dunlap was ordained at the house of Rev. Andrew LeLercier, which was a small brick church on School St., in Boston. The Ordaining Presbytery was composed of Rev. Mr. LeLercier of Boston, Rev. Mr. Norton of Coleraine, N.H., Rev. Mr. Davidson of Londonderry, N.H., Rev. Mr. Wilson, and Rev. Mr. McLothlin

Mr. Dunlap was the first settled minister in Brunswick, although there had been several who had preached there. He remained there 13 years, and resigned in Oct. of 1760 over a dispute on payment of his salary and the source of the money.

Robert Given and Vincent Woodside were a committee to go after him at Sheepscoot, where he was then preaching.

He was voted 4 pounds per Sabbath by the town during his probation. In March, 1748, town voted to settle him at 200 pounds per year and a gift of 200 pounds when the war should be over. They voted to hire a house for his use during the war and to pay the charges.

1754, The Proprietors deeded 150 acres to Mr. Dunlap

1755, A meeting house was built at Newmeadows

1759, the town voted that the South - east part of the town was to have preaching every other Sunday

In Oct., 1760, a council, consisting of Rev. Mr. Smith, of Falmouth, Rev. Mr. Merrill, of Biddeford, and Rev. Mr. Lorraine, dismissed Rev. Mr. Dunlap. (He was a Presbyterian and they were Congregationalists.)

Letter to the Town of Brunswick:

"To the Town of Brunswick, June 30, 1760, Seeing it pleased Divine Providence to obstruct my being in Londonderry at the last sitting of the Presbytery, which will appear in my Journal & other evidence, if called; I, by advice of some worthy men; offer to ye consideration these proposals —

1st. That no mans money or Rates Shall ever Come as Ministerial Taxes In this town; that do not adhere to my ministry.

2ndly. That such as be or may be adherents to my Ministry Have Liberty to pay there ministerial taxes & other Ecclesiastical Dues when they Go to hear the word; or have or may join in connection with the old Church of Christ in Brunswick and such as pretend any Scruple of Conscience in Joining with us. I Lord not over their Consciences; they may use their Christian Liberty; Their money shall be at their own disposal. I have always thought this was the best way to peace; tho't I would Rather quit my title to part of a town tax or Rate, than have a hand In Divisions; and uneasyness. I am no longer able to live under —

2nd Proposition: Whether Deacon Hinkley & Capt. David Dunning; as we have a Revd. and good Presbytery to go to; will continue their adherence, as I think we agreed and Signified and for which I am now preparing & still am Desirous of Such Government & Do profess to the west, —

3d ; that whereas you are or ma Be acquainted with my going westward Twice. First, to ask Council tending to the Publick Benefit and tranquillity that unhappy divisions might be healed.

Seacond, To wait on the Revd. P.E.Y. which wind and weather disappointed me. My Journal will demonstrate this. I therefore intreat you would let me

have my arrears of last sallery. I have no minutes of the exact time when I accepted ye Call, But am pretty certain it was in March or April, after which I looked on myself yr minister, tho not really Ordained and went to Boston to prepare myself after which no pay was Rec'd by Me from aney people for preaching the Gospel; as far as I can Remember; But came to Brunswick in the night of the eighth day of July which I am Ready to Depons. You may all see I am not wanting aney Charges; only my Just Arears; Which will Satisfy & may possibly make us Easy. Sure I think I am at the Honest part.

Altho I spent my own money, about 30 pounds, Going to Boston & hiring a horse and riding to Derry when I was Ordained:-

And these last expenses; which I am sure is more & not less; of which I say nothing at this time.

That there should be more than one Robert Dunlap in the area of Brunswick, who were , from all available records, not related to any close degree, was surely a remarkable coincidence. But it seems to be a fact.

Robert Dunlap of Topsham came from Ireland prior to 1731. Thus he seems to have been the earlier arrival of the two Roberts.

He bought lot #61 in 1731. His only son John had lot #60 in 1738.

He had two daughters;

Jane who married Daniel Eaton

Margaret who married James Potter.

There is little information on this family and like many other families, which bore the ~~same~~ same name as another, their descendants become confused with each other and the more prominent one receives the attention.

The coincidence of first names is another factor which is very confusing as both families used the same first names for their children.

Of those which have been unable to be placed, the following are some which must be of the Topsham family as the dates place them in the area before it was possible for the family of Rev. Robert Dunlap to have been old enough.

The following has been extracted from the genealogy of Mitchell of Kittery.

There were two distinct families of Mitchells who came to Maine in the early 1600s and 1700s.

One family descended from Experience Mitchell who came over to this country in the "Ann", the third ship to land at Plymouth, coming in 1623.

He m. Jane Cooke, d/o Francis Cooke and Hester Mahieu. Francis Cooke came over on the Mayflower in 1620.

Some of this family of Mitchells came to live in Maine in the mid 1700s, settling in N o. Yarmouth. The only members of this family who lived in Freeport, came in the early 1800s from Whitman, Mass. Capt Josiah Mitchell of the "Hornet" fame was of this family.

There is some uncertainty about the origin of the other Mitchell family.

They may be descended from Paul Mitchell, who came over to Kittery with John Winton and d. 1654.

Another possible early ancestor may have been Capt. John Mitchell who lived on Smutty Nose Island in 1660 and d. the same year, 1660.

The first certain ancestor of the Mitchells in Kittery was Christopher, so he is being placed in the number one generation. It is quite certain that there was no connection between the two families on this side of the Atlantic, whatever their connection (if any, in England.

The following statement was among the notes on the Dyer family.

"Robert Mitchell came from Kittery to Cape Elizabeth after 1730, m. Mirriam Jordan, b. abt 1727, d/o Dominicus Jordan. He was a descendent of Jonathan Mitchell, b. England in 1624, came to Cambridge, Mass. Was a graduate of Harvard and ordained a minister in 1650 Robert Mitchell had 3 sons."

No basis can be found for parts of this statement. Robert's ancestor was definitely Christopher and the dates preclude any connection between a Jonathan and Christopher. The accepted lineage follows

It is here in the notes that it states that "Benjamin Mitchell was of the Mitchells descended from Experience Mitchell who m. Jane Cooke etc.". All records show that Benjamin was descended from Christopher Mitchell of Kittery Benjamin and Sarah Mitchell built a house soon after they were married, in Danville. They got homesick and moved to Great Chebeague Island.

Benjamin Mitchell joined the Rev. Army, Jan. 4, 1776, served in Capt. B. Martin's Co. to Nov.; also in Capt. Benjamin Larrabee's Co., Col. Jonathan Mitchell's Regt; also under the same captain Col. Freeman's Regt., and in Capt Swift's Co. in the same Regt..

Between Nov. 1, 1776 and Sept. 6, 1778, he served at Falmouth. He also served from July 31st to Sept. 26, 1781, on the Sloop "Defence", James Nevins commanding. He enlisted 7/13/1782 for 3 months or the length of the war. (From S.A.R.)

1 As early as 1641, Rev. Robert Jordan, a clergyman of the Church of England, was established at Richmond's Island. The precise time of his coming, nor his place of nativity are not known. It is probable that he came in 1639 from Dorsetshire or Devonshire. He m. at Richmonds Island Sarah Winter, child of John Winter, an only child. On the death of Mr. Winter in 1645, Jordan was made Administrator of the estate. He thus became one of the great land holders and wealthy man of that region. He moved from Richmond's Island to that portion of the Winter estate called Spurwink, which name it retains yet. It lay in that part of Falmouth now called Cape Elizabeth. Robert Jordan d. 1679.

Upon his father's death, he became owner, by will, of 1000 acres of land at Spurwink. He had a block-house on the Spurwink river and was noted as an Indian fighter. He was very hospitable to the Indians in time of peace and they exchanged their furs with him for what they needed.

On the outbreak of hostilities, in 1703, a party of Indians, appearing friendly, called on Dominicus on Aug. 10th of that year, to buy some goods. He did not suspect their treachery and Dominicus was struck on the head with a hatchet when he was not looking. He died at once and his wife and family of six children and his youngest brother, Jeremiah, were made prisoners and led through the wilderness to Canada. All were finally returned except a daughter who remained with her master in Canada. This was Mary Ann who was given the name of Arabelle. She claimed her share of the estate however.
