So I've hontacted and taught doys and girls of all ages and love them all. I attend the Catholic Church and teach a class of Sunday School each week. My husband Buston and I have one daughter, through my teaching Sam a member of there Educational Associations: Machens Varent - Trackers (past pres); machias Valley Teachers' Club (past pres); Drushington County Leachers Usesoc.
