
Volunteers in communities throughout
Massachusetts turn out in large numbers each
September and October for COASTSWEEP, the
statewide coastal cleanup program sponsored by
the Massachusetts Office of Coastal Zone
Management (CZM) and coordinated by the Urban
Harbors Institute (UHI) of the University of
Massachusetts Boston.


COASTSWEEP is part of the International Coastal Cleanup (ICC) organized by Ocean Conservancy in Washington, DC. Through the efforts of the ICC, volunteers from all over the world collect marine debris and record information about the trash they collect. This information is then analyzed and used to identify sources of debris and to develop education and policy initiatives to help reduce marine debris globally.

Goals and Objectives

COASTSWEEP promotes a cleaner environment through education and community service. The program's goals include:

- Educating people about marine debris (the sources, impacts, and solutions)
- Encouraging people to participate in COASTSWEEP events
- Removing marine debris from the environment
- Contributing the ICC's efforts to reduce marine debris globally





Approaches and Methods

COASTSWEEP partners with community volunteers who offer to serve as Coordinators for specific cleanup events. Coordinators work with COASTSWEEP to:

- Identify the cleanup site(s);
- Recruit volunteers;
- Secure permissions from beach managers;
- Notify the press; and
- Collect data from volunteers

In return, COASTSWEEP provides Coordinators with:

- Cleanup supplies (bags, gloves, safety instructions, data cards, pencils)
- Educational information about marine debris
- Event publicity on the COASTSWEEP website and Facebook Page

Results/Impacts

Each year, between 2,000-3,000 volunteers participate in COASTSWEEP events around the Commonwealth. Together, they clean more than 100 miles of shoreline and collect an average of 24,000

pounds of debris annually.
Since 2003, nearly 22,000
COASTSWEEP volunteers have
participated in cleanup events,
collecting and recording information
about more than 220,000 pounds
of marine debris!

- Build a social movement to demand Trash Free Seas;
- Engage industry to develop solutions; and
- Promote policy reform
