

A note about the information

The *Highest Paying Jobs in Maine* table lists 100 of Maine's highest paying occupations with five or more projected annual openings. Occupations were selected based on their 2004 average hourly wages, and then sorted with the highest paying at the top. The **Entry-Level** and **Experienced Wages** have also been provided. These wages were not determined as part of the Occupational Employment Statistics Survey, but were calculated from the distribution of wages reported for each occupation. By definition, the **Entry-Level Wage** is the mean (average) of the lower third of the wage distribution and the **Experienced Wage** is the mean (average) of the upper two-thirds of the wage distribution.

The **Estimated Employment** column represents 2004 estimated base year employment, obtained from 2004-2014 Occupational Employment Projections. The **Annual Job Openings** column is an estimate of expected job openings per year. It combines expected new job openings with openings to replace those who leave an occupation. However, the **Annual Job Openings** column does not display actual, current job openings.

The Average Weekly Wages in Maine by County, 2005 table shows that wages in Maine vary from county to county. This table displays those differences without regard to a specific occupation or industry. Wage rates do vary by industry, as well as by occupation and geography. Industry variations are displayed in the Average Weekly Wages in Maine by Industry, 2005 table. Industry sectors are shown by the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS).
