

Mothers continue to be the largest proportion of enrolled adults.


As enrollment has slowed, 20% of families no longer have children under 6 yrs.



BCT enrolls a large percentage of Spanish speaking families. To date, 29% of families speak Spanish as compared to the average for the six neighborhoods of 17.1%. There are slightly less families speaking Haitian Creole, 3% compared to the combined neighborhood averages of 9.7% speaking French or French Creole. And there are slightly more Portuguese plus Cape Verdean Creole speakers (10% compared to 7% for the neighborhood averages).

BCT Enrolls a High Number of Low Income Families

BCT uses a proxy to measure income since data on income is not tracked at enrollment. Families are considered to be low income, if they receive one or more of the following subsidies: WIC, DTA, SNAP or SSI. Using this formula, 64% of enrolling families are low income.



Two communities, FCCT and ABCT, account for 82% of all recorded instances of participation. Not surprisingly, these communities also show the greatest average number of instances of participation per family, suggesting deep ongoing communication with the families choosing to engage with BCT efforts.



Participation Rates of BCT Families



Mothers are participating at greater rates compared with the number of enrolled mothers. And although there are a relatively large number of fathers enrolled, they participate less frequently. The languages spoken in the families of participating adults show heavy participation by the Vietnamese community, due primarily to FCCT. Spanish speaking families are participating at slightly lower rates than enrolled families speaking Spanish.

Relationship to Child of Participating Adult Compared to Enrollment Data






Participation Rates by Income





% of Participating Families Who Are Low Income Compared to % of Enrolled Families






Participation Rates by Education



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Family Composition of Participating Families




Adults from single-headed households comprised the largest portion of unique families participating in activities. However, these families participated slightly less often, accounting for only 38% of all instances of attendance.



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
Age of Children in the Family at the Time of the Recorded Activity





The maps above and on the proceeding page, suggest significant overlap in participation between FCCT and DCT. However, there is little evidence of card holders frequenting or participating in each other's activities (see adjacent chart). This suggests that families may have two or more cards or connection is not primarily determined by geography alone.







ABCT enrolls a large percentage of Spanish speaking families. To date, 30% of families speak Spanish as compared to the neighborhood average of 8.7%. ABCT is enrolling a fairly high number of Cape Verdean and Portuguese speaking families (7% compared to the neighborhood average of 2.3%). There are slightly less families speaking either Mandarin or Cantonese - 5% compared to the combined neighborhood average of 7.4% for these languages. Also of note are the higher number of families speaking another language other than English (12% compared to 8.2%).



Participation Rates of ABCT Families







Mothers are participating at greater rates compared with the number of enrolled mothers. And although there are a relatively large number of fathers enrolled, they participate less frequently. The languages spoken in the families of participating adults roughly mirror languages spoken in the homes of all enrolled families, with lower participation by Portuguese / Cape Verdean speaking families and higher participation by Chinese speaking families.






Participation Rates by Income









Participation Rates by Education







Family Composition of Participating Families








Age of Children in the Family at the Time of the Recorded Activity







DCT enrolled a large percentage of Cape Verdean Creole speaking families. To date, 14% of DCT families speak either Portuguese or Cape Verdean Creole as compared to the neighborhood average of 8.2%. DCT has also enrolled a high number of Spanish speaking families, 28% compared to the neighborhood average of 23.8%. However, there are fewer Haitian Creole speakers (2%) when compared to the neighborhood average of 8.6% French and French Creole speakers.






Relationship to Child of Participating Adult Compared to Enrollment Data






Participation Rates by Income






Participation Rates by Education







Family Composition of Participating Families







Age of Children in the Family at the Time of the Recorded Activity















Participation Rates by Income








Participation Rates by Education





Family Composition of Participating Families




Age of Children in the Family at the Time of the Recorded Activity




Relationship to Child of Participating Adult Compared to Enrollment Data






Participation Rates by Income






Family Composition of Participating Families





Age of Children in the Family at the Time of the Recorded Activity



South Boston Enrolls a High Number of Low Income Families

BCT uses a proxy to measure income since data on income is not tracked at enrollment. Families are considered to be low income, if they receive one or more of the following subsidies: WIC, DTA, SNAP or SSI. Using this formula, 45% of enrolling families are low income.







Relationship to Child of Participating Adult Compared to Enrollment Data






Participation Rates by Income






Participation Rates by Education



The educational attainment of the enrolling families mirrors the educational attainment of participating families.



Percent Participating S. Boston Families Compared to Enrolled Families with High School Degree or Less*






Family Composition of Participating Families



Participation by Family Composition


Age of Children in the Family at the Time of the Recorded Activity
