Know all men by these presents that
I Isaac Allen of Minot in the County
of Cumberland & State of Maine, have
constituted Nathan E. Woodbury, of
Minot in said County, Esq. my Attorney
in my stead & place, to receive my
certificate for the allowance of land
by the Legislature of 1835, or such
allowance as may be made by the Legislature
of 1836, the same being allowed to me
as a surviving pensioner of the
Revolutionary army, and in my name
to sign any papers that may be
necessary for the obtaining of said cer-
tificate - & I further authorize said
Woodbury to make sale of said cer-
tificate to the best advantage - &
assign the same for me - The said
Woodbury however, is not to sell said
certificate at a less sum than
one hundred - dollars - & I do ratify
whatever said Woodbury, may lawfully
do by this instrument. In witness
whereof, I have hereunto set my hand & seal
this twenty eighth day of January, 1836.

HUNDRED ACRES OF LAND.

I Isaac Allen of Minot in the County of
Cumberland and State of Maine on oath
testify and say that I enlisted in the
army of the Revolution, ^{as a Soldier} in the first three
years service which term of three years
I faithfully served and to the end and
was honorably discharged. I enlisted I
think on the twenty seventh day of October
Seventeen hundred and Seventy Seven
and I served under Captain Sumner
and Colonel Henry Jackson in the
Sixteenth Regiment, and was discharged
under said officers. The date of my discharge
I cannot recollect as it has long since
been lost. At the time of my enlistment
I resided in New Gloucester County of
Cumberland and now State of Maine,
and on the seventeenth day of March
eighteen hundred and thirty five I
resided in Minot in said County
and I further testify that I have never
received any Grant of land or money
from the common wealth of Massachusetts
nor any one claiming under me
and that I think I am justly entitled to
one under under the provisions of the Resolves
of the ~~last~~ Legislature
