And I do authorize & empower my said Attorney, for me, & in my name, to sign all such receipts & vouchers, at the Land-Office, on receiving the said warrant, as are necessary & proper, according to the rules & regulations of the Land-Office, hereby binding myself to stand to fulfill & abide by all & singular such matters & things, as my said Attorney shall, in my behalf, lawfully do, in the premises.

I, Lechman Merrill of Portland, a non-commissioned officer of the revolutionary army of the United States, certify that I am well acquainted with Sarah Bailey, the lawful wife, and widow of Hudson Bailey late a soldier of the revolutionary army, deceased - that the said Sarah Bailey, widow whose signature is affixed to annexed certificate is the lawful wife, and at present widow of Hudson Bailey late a soldier of the revolutionary army, - that I was well acquainted with the said Hudson Bailey and Sarah Bailey aforesaid while the said Hudson and Sarah aforesaid were living at Portland by man and wife previous to the decease of the said Hudson that the said Hudson Bailey aforesaid joined the revolutionary army at Portland A.D. seventeen hundred & twenty-five for three years and continued a soldier of the revolutionary army until the close of the year seventeen hundred & twenty-seven with the company commanded by Thomas Ripley, and that the said Hudson Bailey aforesaid deceased late a soldier of the revolutionary army, deceased at sea while an inhabitant of Maine, viz. that the said
