I *Susannah Bayley* of *Woolwich* in the County of *Lincoln* and State of Maine, aged *seventy one* years, do, upon oath, declare in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 24, 1836, entitled a "Resolve additional to a Resolve, passed March seventeenth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, entitled 'Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers,'" that I am the widow of *Daniel Bayley* late of *Woolwich* in the County of *Lincoln* and state of Maine, who died at *Woolwich aforesaid* on the *thirteenth* day of *March* A. D. *1817* That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *Daniel Bayley* did enlist

*as a private soldier in the Revolutionary War in the year 1777 for three years - I always understood that he enlisted at the same time & for the same term of service, and in the same company with his two brothers Josiah Bayley & Joseph Bayley. I have ascertained that Josiah Bayley aforesaid was in Capt. Burnhams Company, Col. Michael Jacksons Massachusetts Regiment, & I believe that my said husband also enlisted into the same Company & that I always supposed that he served about the three years, but I have lately understood that he was discharged a few days before the said three years expired. I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *Daniel Bayley* was at the time of his said enlistment, an inhabitant of *Woolwich aforesaid**

and that I do know that he was at the time of his decease as aforesaid, an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, residing in *Woolwich* aforesaid, where he had resided for *fifty nine* years before his decease. That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that neither my said late husband, nor any one claiming under him did receive, (nor have I received since his decease,) a grant of land, or money in lieu thereof, either from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, or the State of Maine, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve.

I *Susannah Bailey* of *Woolwich* in the County of *Lincoln* and State of Maine, aged *seventy* years, do, upon oath, declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," that I am the widow of *Daniel Bailey* late of *Woolwich* in the County of *Lincoln* and State of Maine, who died at *Woolwich* on the *thirtieth* day of *March* A. D. 1817

That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *Daniel Bailey* did enlist as a private soldier in the Revolutionary War in the year 1776 or 1777 for three years on the continental establishments. I do not recollect the name of his Captain, but he served in Colonel Michael Jacksons Massachusetts Regiment and was discharged at West Point on the 21<sup>st</sup> of February 1780, and the annexed paper is his original discharge that he brought home with him from the Army & has ever since been preserved in our family, — the reason of his discharge was because he had fully served out the three years for which he enlisted.

I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *Daniel Bailey* was at the time of his said enlistment, an inhabitant of *Woolwich* in the County of *Lincoln* & State of *Maine*

and that I do know that he was at the time of his decease as aforesaid, an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, residing in *Woolwich* aforesaid, where he had resided for *sixty* years before his decease. That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that neither my said late husband, nor any one claiming under him did receive, (nor have I received since his decease,) a grant of Land, or money in lieu thereof, from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve.
