of Circuit Court of Common Pleas, June 1820

ON this *twenty seventh* day of *June* in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty, personally appeared in open court, being a court of record within and for said County and State of Maine, established by a law of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, made and passed on the ~~eleventh~~ *fourth* day of June, A. D. 1811, and recognized by the Constitution of the State of Maine *Nathan*

Parsons aged, *sixty nine* years, resident in *Warragar* in said County of Penobscot, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: *In 1775 June*

I enlisted into the service at Cambridge in Capt. Tho' Porter's company of Artillery Col^o Gridley's Reg^t as Serjeant, and remained in service until December in the same year.

*In 1776 January, I enlisted into Capt. Josiah Lyman's Company as Serjeant, Col^o Porter's Reg^t marched to Quebec, and after our defeat there, returned to Mount Independence in the State of Vermont. This was in the year service so called. *Nov* *line**

*Immediately after I returned, in 1777 I received the appointment of Ensign in Capt. Smith's company Col^o Marshall's Reg^t in the *line*, the number of our Reg^t I do not recollect, ~~...~~*

*I was at the battle at Saratoga at the surrender of General Burgoin, - In the spring of 1778 I was at the battle of Monmouth, as acting Adjutant of the day - In the fall following I was one of the discharged Officers, and in the winter of 1779 I received my discharge, I am a *Blacksmith**

by Trade - and have made a distinction before the Hon^o Court of Penobscot on the 22^d of April 1810 - as follows

- Plina Parsons* - *no right hand crippled -*
- Penelope* - *and owing to advanced*
- Fiddlers* - *77 age and debilitated health*
- Mary* - *49 and not able to support an*
- Penelope* - *13 self without the assistance*
- Anna* - *4 of the United States.*

AND I *Nathan Parsons* do solemnly swear, that I was a resident citizen of the United States on the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner whatever, disposed of my property, or any part thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of Congress, entitled "An act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service of the United States in the Revolutionary War," passed on the eighteenth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me: nor have I any income, other than what is contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed.
