I hereby Certify, That, from an examination of the Books and Documents, relating to Military Services in the War of the Revolution, which remain in this Department, it appears that the name of Samuel Fagg, as a Drummer, is borne in the Continental Army Books, where it appears he enlisted for three years, and is allowed for services in Capt. Hastings' Company, in Col. Henry Jackson's Regt. from August 10th 1777 to the 10th of August 1780, thirty six Months and one day. m. d.

I *Samuel A. Flagg* of *Nobleboro* in the County of *Lincoln* and State of Maine, aged *seventy one* years, do, upon oath, declare in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," that I enlisted *a drummer in Col. Henry Jackson's*

Regiment tenth of Augt. seventeen hundred & eighty seven,
at which time I was a resident of the town of *Boston* State of *Massachusetts*, & having served *three* years, the term for which I enlisted, I was then *honorably* discharged on the tenth of *Augt. seventeen hundred & eighty*.

I do further on oath declare that at the time of my said enlistment, I was an inhabitant of *Boston* State of *Massachusetts*,

and was on the 17th day of March, 1835, have been ever since, and am now an inhabitant of the State of Maine, residing in *Nobleboro* aforesaid, where I have resided for *forty* years past. That neither I, nor any one claiming under me, has ever received a grant of Land, or money in lieu thereof from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for my said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am justly entitled to the benefit of said Resolve.

Sir, Having lately read your Notice to the Revolutionary Soldiers, an amended Law past the last Session of our general Court to grant to them 200 Acres of Land, as a Compensation of their three years service in the Revolution War - together with your generous offer'd service to be their agent, and give them Certificates, who could prove their claim to the same upon your Satisfaction, I hereby give you my affidavit or Confirmation, which I have made oath to before one of our honorable Justices of the Peace, who has signed the same as you may see

I hereby certify that I was born in the Town of Boston in the year 1763 - July 8th - & at the age of 14 - in the year 1777 - listed into the Care of Norwich, Colonel Henry Jackson's Regiment, & there in remained till I had finished the full term of three years, which terminated in August 10th 1780 - I got my discharge when the Regiment was at Kings ferry, between Rivers that leads from New York to Albany - then returned to Boston - where I lived until the year 1790, from thence I came down to Worcester, and after having moved about from one place to another, I at last took up my residence in the Town of Nobleboro, where I now remain to the present time - My Neighbours & Friends can testify to the same - yours with great respect Samuel A. Flagg, Personally appeared before me, the said Samuel, I gave oath to the above Declaration - this 21st Day of June 1835

I Sally C Bond of Jefferson in the County of Lincoln testify and say that I was born (as I was informed by my parents in the town of Newcastle in the County of Lincoln near the State of Maine My fathers name was William Nichols and moved to Boston when I was only six months old in the year 1783 - and I lived in Boston in the State of Massachusetts until I was twenty six years of age, and that I was well acquainted with Samuel A. Flagg who lived his time with my uncle John Jenkins Baker by trade I also now state that the same Samuel A. Flagg is an Inhabitant of the town of Nobleboro in the County of Lincoln and was at the time and has been ever since the District of Maine was separated from Massachusetts the Proprietor - I am knowing to a great part of the statements made by the said Samuel A. Flagg to be true and have no doubt that it is all true, and Samuel A. Flagg is an Elder of the Baptist Church
