

widow of James Jordan late of said Monroe, deceased,
by declaration sworn to on the 25th day of Septem. last,

(See claim N^o. 528.)
and other accompanying evidence has satisfactorily proved her claim
to the benefits of a "Resolve in favor of certain officers and soldiers of
the Revolutionary war and the widows of deceased officers and soldiers;"
approved March 17, A. D. 1835, and that "THE LAWFUL HOLDER" of this
certificate is entitled, under the provisions of a Resolve additional to said
Resolve, approved March 16, 1836, to **TWO HUNDRED ACRES OF
LAND.**

Know all Men by these presents that I Hannah Jourdan of
Monroe in the County of Waldo widow of James Jourdan late of
said Monroe deceased, in consideration of Seventy five dollars
by me received of William Woart Jun^r Esq^r of Augusta in the
County of Kennebec, have assigned and do by these presents
assign and forever quit claim to the said William his heirs
and assigns forever the foregoing certificate of the Land agent
of Maine, and do hereby authorize the said Land agent to
convey the said Two hundred acres of land therein mentioned
to the said William Woart Jun^r his heirs and assigns forever,
and I hereby relinquish to the said William and his assigns
all claim whatever to the said certificate and the said
Two hundred acres of land therein mentioned.

I Hannah Jordan of Monroe in the County of
Waldo State of Maine, the widow James Jordan late
of Monroe deceased upon oath declare in order to
obtain the benefit of a Resolve passed by the Legislature
of the State of Maine March 17. 1835 entitled a Re-
-solve in favor of certain Officers & Soldiers of the Rev-
-olutionary War & the Widow of deceased Officers & Soldiers
that my deceased husband enlisted into
Capt Richard Mayberry's Company & 10th
Regiment on or about the Month of January 1776
at Windham County of Cumberland according to my
best belief - that he was then an In-
habitant of said Windham in the
Western District now State of Maine - and
was an Inhabitant of said Monroe
on the day of his decease which was
on the last day of March 1813

that neither he, nor any one claiming under
him has ever received a grant of land or
money in lieu thereof from the Commonwealth
of Massachusetts for his said services during
the Revolutionary War, & that I am as his
widow justly entitled to the benefit of said

Know all men by these Presents That I Hannah
Jordan of Monroe in the County of Waldorf State of Maine
being the same person by whom the preceding Declaration
was made do hereby conclude to appoint William
Worship of Augusta in the County of Kennebec my true
& lawful Attorney for me & in my name & stead
to receive from the Land Agent of the State of Maine
such Certificate as he may issue to me in virtue
of a Resolve of said State passed March 17th 1835
entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain officers and
Soldiers of the Revolutionary War & the Widows of deceased
Officers & Soldiers" to the benefit of which Resolve I am
entitled - And my said Attorney is hereby au-
thorized & empowered upon the receipt of said Cer-
tificate for me & in my name to execute such
receipt or acknowledgment thereof as I might were
I personally present - hereby ratifying & confirming
whenever my Attorney shall do by virtue hereof
