I *Lucy Mallett* of *Maine* in the County of *Lincoln* and State of Maine, aged *eighty four* years, do, upon oath, declare in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 24, 1836, entitled a "Resolve additional to a Resolve, passed March seventeenth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, entitled 'Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers,'" that I am the widow of *Thomas Bennett* late of *Georgetown* in the County of *Lincoln* and state of Maine, who died *while a Soldier in the War of the Revolution* on the *month* day of *October* A. D. 1777 That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *Thomas Bennett* did enlist as a *private* for three years into *Bradford's* regiment of the *Line* *Massachusetts*, in the Revolutionary War in the year 1777 that before the expiration of the term of his enlistment he died in the Army hospital at *Albany* in the *State of New York*

I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *Thomas Bennett* was at the time of his said enlistment, an inhabitant of *Georgetown* in the *then District of Maine*

and that I do know that he was at the time of his decease as aforesaid, an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, *residing in* *Georgetown* aforesaid, where he had resided for *many* years before his decease. That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that neither my said late husband, nor any one claiming under him did receive, (nor have I received since his decease,) a grant of land, or money in lieu thereof, either from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, or the State of Maine, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve.

Lucy Mallett of *Wales* in the County of *Lincoln* and State of Maine, being the same person by whom the foregoing declaration was made, do hereby constitute and appoint *George Mott* of *Augusta* my true and lawful Attorney for me and in my name, to receive from the Land Agent of the State of Maine, such certificate as he may issue to me, in virtue of a Resolve of the said State, passed March 24, 1836, entitled a "Resolve additional to a Resolve, passed March seventeenth, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty five, entitled 'Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers,'" to the benefit of which Resolve I am entitled. And my said Attorney is hereby authorized and empowered upon the receipt of said certificate, for me and in my name, to execute such receipt or acknowledgment therefor, as I might, were I personally present.

HEREBY ratifying and confirming whatever my Attorney shall do by virtue hereof, Witness my hand and seal this *thirtieth* day of *October* A. D. 1837
