soldiers," approved March 17, A. D. 1835, and that "the lawful  
holder" of this certificate is entitled, under said Resolve, to TWO  
HUNDRED ACRES OF LAND.

I Sally Libby of Poland in the County of  
Cumberland and State of Maine Widow  
and next of kin James Libby late of  
Danville in the County of Cumberland of and  
deceased: on oath testify and say that  
my late husband James Libby entered I think  
into the second three years service of the  
Revolutionary war, and that at the time he  
entered he resided in Strandwater in the  
then district now State of Maine I think he  
served in the fifth Regiment, the Colonel and  
Captain's name I have after become my husband  
but cannot now recollect, I am very  
certain that he served his time out and was  
honorably discharged at the end of the war,  
I do not recollect the date of his discharge  
nor I never saw it, that he died in Danville  
Cumberland on the fifth day of May 1828 and  
that neither he or any one claiming under  
him has ever received a Grant of Land or money  
from or from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts  
and that I believe I am fully entitled  
to ~~own~~ a Grant of Land under the provisions  
of the Resolves of our last Legislature, and  
that I and my husband were Inhabitants of  
Danville aforesaid at the time of his decease,

Nathaniel L. Rogers of Durville in said County  
my true and lawful attorney for me and in  
my name to receive from the Land Agent of  
the State of Maine, such certificate as he may  
issue to me in virtue of a Resolution of the said  
State passed March 17. th A.D. 1835 entitled  
a Resolution in favor of certain Officers and  
Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the  
widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers, to  
the benefit of which Resolution I was entitled  
and my said attorney is hereby authorized  
and empowered upon the receipt of said  
certificate for me and in my name to execute  
such receipt or acknowledgment thereof as I  
might want I personally present hereby  
ratifying and confirming whatever my  
attorney shall do by virtue hereof, witness  
my hand and seal this fifteenth day of  
August A.D. 1835.
