I *Phoebe M. Luigg* of *Newcastle* in the County of *Lincoln* and State of Maine, aged *ninety* years, do, upon oath, declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," that I am the widow of *Daniel M. Luigg* late of *Newcastle* in the County of *Lincoln* and State of Maine, who died at *Newcastle* on the *fifth* day of *June* A. D. *1816*

That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *Daniel M. Luigg* did enlist as a private soldier in the war of the Revolution in the year *1777* for three years on the continental establishment in *Captain Abner Wedd's* Company, Colonel *Michael Jackson* *Messa* - *Cherette's* Regiment, and that he served the three years out fully & was honorably discharged in *1780*, which discharge is lost, and that the reason of his discharge was, that the time for which he had enlisted had fully expired.

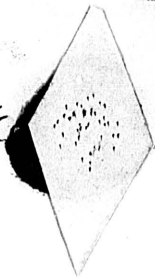

& Revolutionary Soldier deceased. We both enlisted in the
Revolutionary Wars in March 1777 for three years, in Cap-
tain Abner Wades Company, Colonel Michael Jacksons
Massachusetts Regiment, Tom Brooks Lieutenant Colonel - said
M. Leigg continued in the service of said & in said Company,
until he served said three years out, and he was discharged
in March 1780 at West Point. I well recollect said M. Leigg
and he & myself served in said Company together the
three years aforesaid. ~

tised. but I supposed all the evidence was in your
hands in relation to his services. Mrs McQuigg is
in her 93 year. & if there be any thing for her she
