Moody named in the foregoing Power and Affidavit, do hereby constitute, appoint and make ROBERT C. VOSE, of AUGUSTA, in the County of Kennebec, my Attorney irrevocable, for me and in my name and stead to bargain for, sell; dispose of and transfer to any person, and upon such terms as he may think best, the Certificate which he may obtain for me of the Land Agent, and of my right and interest in and to the Land to which I shall be entitled in virtue thereof and of the Resolve aforesaid. And in case my said Attorney shall not sell or transfer such certificate before the Land shall be surveyed and laid out into lots as provided in said Resolve, and ready for selection and conveyance, I further hereby authorize and empower my said Attorney to represent me before the Land Agent, and for me and in my stead to select and make choice of the lot of Land to which I am entitled, and to receive from the Land Agent a Deed and Conveyance thereof to me in fee, and after having obtained such Deed and Conveyance, I hereby further authorize and empower my said Attorney to sell and dispose of such lot of Land on such terms and conditions as he may think proper, and for me and in my name and stead to make, execute and deliver a Deed and Conveyance thereof to the purchaser, as fully as I could do if present.  I *Lucy* *Moody* of *Maine* in the County of *Cumberland* and State of Maine, aged *twenty one* - years, do, upon oath declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," that I am the widow of *Daniel Moody* late of *Danville* in the County of *Cumberland* and State of Maine, who died at *Danville* on the *twelfth* day of *April* - A. D. *1811*
 That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *Daniel Moody* did enlist in a *private* in the year *1777* for *3* years into *Skinner's* company & *Danville* part of the *Mass^d* line in the Army of the Revolution & was on *both* *discovery* *at* *West Point* in the year *1780* having served the full period of three years

I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *Daniel Moody* was at the time of his said enlistment, an inhabitant of *the then District of Maine (Scarboro)* and that I do know that he was at the time of his decease as aforesaid, an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, residing in *Danville* aforesaid, where he had resided for *several* years before his decease. That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that neither my said late husband, nor any one claiming under him did receive, (nor have I received since his decease,) a grant of Land, or money in lieu thereof, from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve.

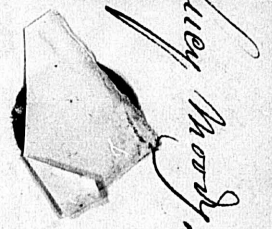
