

I *Judith Robinson* of *Luben* in the County of *Washington* and State of Maine, aged *sixty four* years, do, upon oath, declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," that I am the widow of *James Randall* late of *Luben* in the County of *Washington* and State of Maine, who died at *Luben* on the *second* day of *June* A. D. *1829*

That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *James Randall* did enlist *for during the war of the Revolution* but at what time I cannot now say - I further swear that three years since I married *David Robinson* of *Luben*

I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, *James Randall* was at the time of his said enlistment, an inhabitant of *Lynn in the State of Massachusetts* and that I do know that he was at the time of his decease as aforesaid, an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, residing in *Luben* aforesaid, where he had resided for *about forty* years before his decease. That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that neither my said late husband, nor any one claiming under him did receive, (nor have I received since his decease,) a grant of Land, or money in lieu thereof, from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve.
