Saco, April 7. 1836.

Sir,

Your letter of the 6th inst. covering the certificate of the Land Agent, No. 312, certifying that Isabella Robinson has satisfactorily proved her claim to the benefits of a Resolve in favor of certain officers & soldiers &c. &c. &c. approved 17. March 1835. & that the lawful holder of s^d. certificate is entitled, under the provisions of an additional Resolve of the Legislature of Maine of 16th. March last, to two hundred acres of land is received.

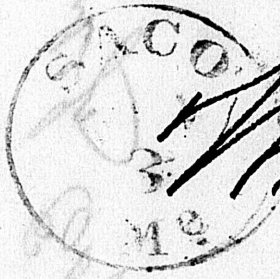

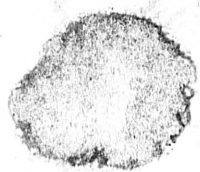



I Francis Libby of Paxton in the County
of York aged seventy four on oath do testify
and say that I enlisted into the military
service of the United States during the revolution-
ary war with Great Brittain into the
three year service so called in the ^{Company} Command
by Capt. Maybury, and that George Robinson
late of Hollis in said County (with whom I was
^{to the time of his decease} ~~then~~ and have ever since been well acquainted)
did enlist into the same company and for the
same term of time, and that he ~~the same~~
George Robinson and myself did serve out
and fully complete the said service of three
years and were then duly and regularly
discharged

I, Isabella Robinson, of Hollis in the County of York & State of Maine, aged seventy three years, do upon oath declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine passed March 17th. 1835. entitled "a Resolve in favor of certain Officers & Soldiers of the Revolutionary War & the Widows of the deceased Officers & Soldiers" that I am the widow of George Robinson of ^{Hollis} Hollis, where he died sixteen years ago last March. That I have reason to believe & do fully believe, that my said husband George Robinson did enlist in the Army in the Revolutionary War, & that he enlisted at Cape Elizabeth and served more than three years. I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe that my said late husband George Robinson, was at the time of his said enlistment an inhabitant of Cape Elizabeth in said State of Maine, & that I do know that he was at the time of his decease aforesaid, an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, residing in Hollis aforesaid where he had resided for two years before his decease, & that he never resided out of the said State of Maine after the termination of said war. That I have reason to believe & do fully believe, that neither my said late husband nor any one claiming under him did receive (nor have I received since his decease) a grant of land, or money in lieu thereof, from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, & that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve.

Know all men by these presents, that I, Isabella Robinson, of Hollis in the County of York & State of Maine, Widow, being the same person by whom the foregoing declaration was made, do, hereby constitute & appoint Lauriston Ward of Saco in said County, Esquire, my true & lawful Attorney for me & in my name to receive from the Land Agent of the State of Maine such Certificate as he may issue to me in virtue of a Resolve of the said State of Maine, passed March 17. 1835. entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers & Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, & the Widows of the deceased Officers & Soldiers," to the benefit of which Resolve I am entitled. And my said Attorney is hereby authorized & empowered upon the Receipt of said Certificate for me & in my name to execute such Receipt for acknowledgment, as I might were I personally present. Hereby ratifying and confirming whatever my said Attorney shall do by virtue hereof. Witness my hand & seal this fifteenth day of October A. D. 1835.
