I, Stephen Fuller, of Lee, in the County of Berkshire
and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, do hereby
certify, that, in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and seventy seven, on the 2nd day of
June, being then an inhabitant of Lunenburg
in the County of Worcester's Commonwealth aforesaid
I enlisted as a private soldier in the Company
of Capt Sylvanus Smith, in the 15th Regiment,
under the command of Col. Timothy Bigelow, and
Gen. Glouers Brigade, for the term of three years,
and that I served during that time, and was
regularly discharged at a place called Budd's
Highlands in the State of New York, and that
I now reside in the town of Lee, County of Berkshire.

Dated at Lee aforesaid this 9th day of May AD 1854

Stephen Fuller, who made solemn oath, that the
above affidavit, by him signed in my presence,
is true.

Before me: Hubbard Bartlett Justice of
the Peace.

Knows all men by these Presents, that I, Stephen
Fuller, of Lee in the County of Berkshire, and
Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for and in
consideration of fifty five dollars to me paid by
Seth S. Cushing, of the City of Boston, Esquire,
do hereby give, grant, sell, convey, assign, set
over and release to the said Cushing, all my
right, title, claim and interest, in and to two
hundred acres of land, granted by the said
Commonwealth, to Soldiers of the Revolutionary
war, by a Resolve of March 27. 1833; and I do
hereby authorize, empower and request the
Said Agent to make a conveyance to said
Cushing of the said two hundred acres of
land: In witness whereof, I have hereunto set
my hand and seal, this first day of April
A. D. 1835.

Fuller acknowledged the above instrument to be his free act
and deed before me Hubbard Bartlett Justice of the Peace

Boston 27 April 1835. In consideration of One
hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by
Abner Coburn. I do hereby assign & relinquish
to said Coburn all the right title & interest
to the within right of land - and hereby
request the Town Agent to execute a Deed
accordingly -
