 Resident of North Hampton in the aforesaid County
 Widow of Hezekiah Hutchins late of North Hampton Deceased
 Aged 73 — Years Do on oath declare that according
 to the best of My knowledge & belief Hezekiah Hutchins
 aforesaid about or in the Year 1777 enlisted into the
 Army of the American Revolution in the Service of the
 Commonwealth of Massachusetts for the term of Three
 Years in a Company Commanded by Captain N. Goodale
 in a Regiment Commanded by Colonel R. Putnam & that
 He faithfully served the full term of His said Enlistment
 and was regularly discharged at Westpoint in the
 State of New York — I further declare that ~~He~~ fur-
 nished satisfactory evidence of His said service to the
 War department of United States & that He received a
 Pension; His certificate of Pension being No. 293
 And that He died at North Hampton aforesaid

~~and~~ about the Year 1825 I further declare
 that I have not received any Money or Land from
 the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in pursuance of
 any Resolve of her Legislature & further that Heze-
 kiah Hutchins Enlisted in the State of Massachusetts
 & was a Resident of said State at the time of his
 Discease

Therefore
 Know all Men by these presents that I
 Deborah Hutchins aforesaid do hereby constitute & Appoint
 Hervey George — of Greenville in the State of New York
 My true & lawful Attorney for Me and in My Name
 to select a Lot of Land ~~at~~ and receive a Title there-
 for or at His discretion to receive instead thereof the
 Commutation offered by the Commonwealth aforesaid
 And to transact all and singular ~~at~~ such business
 as may be necessary for the final settlement of My
 claim on the Commonwealth aforesaid
