I Mary Strout ——— of Dunnington in the County of York — and State of Maine, aged twenty five years, do, upon oath, declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," that I am the widow of Isaac Strout — late of Dunnington in the County of York and State of Maine, who died at Dunnington on the third day of March A. D. 1818

That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, Isaac Strout did enlist in the year 1776 or 1777 as a private in the Infantry of the Army of the Revolution in the Massachusetts line & that he served three full years or more under one enlistment & had an honorable discharge which was once in my possession but now lost, that I do not recollect the Regiment or company that he served in

I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, Isaac Strout — was at the time of his said enlistment, an inhabitant of the town of Cape Elizabeth in the county of Cumberland State (then District) of Maine and that I do know that he was at the time of his decease as aforesaid, an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, residing in Dunnington aforesaid, where he had resided for thirty three years before his decease. That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that neither my said late husband, nor any one claiming under him did receive, (nor have I received since his decease,) a grant of Land, or money in lieu thereof, from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve.
