a Soldier in the late American Army who was returned as a part of this State's quota of said Army, enlisted for during the war with *Great-Britain*, served three years after having so enlisted, and was honorably discharged, hath drawn Lot No. *Forty eight* in a Township of Land, called *Mars'-Hill*, located and lotted, in the eastern part of this Commonwealth, agreeably to a Resolve of the General Court, passed March 9, 1804, and that the said Lot contains two hundred acres, bounded

North on State land east on
lot N^o 36, south on lot N^o 17 and west on
lot N^o 60.

according to a plan of the survey of said township, called *Mars' Hill*, taken by CHARLES TURNER, jun. Esq. September, 1804, and lodged in the Secretary's office ;—and that on return of this *Certificate* into the said Secretary's office, with satisfactory evidence that the duties required by a Resolve of the fifth of March, 1801, have been performed, within four years from the ninth of March, 1804, the said *Elizabeth Long* shall be entitled to a deed of the said Lot of Land in fee simple, to be given by the Secretary in behalf of the Commonwealth.
