Know all Men by these Presents, THAT

I whose name is undersigned & seal hereunto affixed, appointed an AGENT by the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to make and execute conveyances, agreeably to a resolve of said Court passed the seventeenth day of June eighteen hundred and twenty — and pursuant to resolves of said Court passed the twenty seventh day of March eighteen hundred & thirty three, and fourth day of February eighteen hundred & thirty four.

do give, grant, convey and confirm, and by these presents, in behalf of said Commonwealth, have given, granted, conveyed and confirmed unto Ruth Hull of Amesbury, in the County of Essex, and Commonwealth aforesaid, widow of William Lurvey, deceased, formerly a private soldier in the eighth Massachusetts regiment commanded by Colonel Michael Jackson,

who enlisted as a Soldier into the American Army to serve during the revolutionary War with Great Britain, and who was returned as a part of the Massachusetts quota of said Army, and who did actually serve in said Army the full term of three years, and was honorably discharged, and to his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, and interest of said Commonwealth, in and unto a lot of land numbered one hundred and nine

situate and lying in a township, in the County of Tencksboro, in the State of Maine, numbered two in the seventh range of townships West of the Monument at the source of the river W. Croise

said lot contains two hundred acres, bounded one hundred and seventy nine acres, and is received by the said Ruth Hull as an equivalent for two hundred acres to which she is entitled by said resolves of the 4th Feb bounded as follows, viz, On the North by lot number one hundred & ten; On the East by lot number ninety seven; on the South and West by the town line.

according to a plan of the survey of said township made by Joseph L. Healey in the year eighteen hundred and twenty nine and will more fully appear on reference being had to said plan now on file in the Land Office.

To Have and to Hold the aforegranted premises to the said Ruth Hull her heirs and assigns, to her & their use and behoof forever. IN TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal this Twenty seventh day of October in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty four

Resolve on the petition of Ruth Scull,

(widow formerly the wife of M^r Surry, deceased, setting forth his services in the Revolutionary war.)

Resolved, for the reasons set forth in said petition, that the said Ruth Scull is entitled to all the benefits, secured to the widows of officers and soldiers of the Revolutionary War in and by a Resolve approved on the twenty seventh day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty three; and that two hundred acres of the lands therein mentioned be conveyed to her by the Land Agent, or the sum of Fifty dollars be paid to her by the Treasurer of this Commonwealth, at her election, and in the manner expressed in said Resolve.

Massachusetts, widow of Joseph Hull, late of Amesbury afore-
said, deceased; and formerly the widow of William Curvey,
late of said Amesbury, and a soldier in the army of the revolu-
-tionary war, in Captain James Varrum's Company, Col.
Michael Jackson's Regiment, for the term of three years, also
now deceased; have made, constituted and appointed, and do by
these presents make, constitute and appoint, John C. Bartlet,
of said Amesbury, my true and lawful Attorney, for me, and
in my name and stead, and to my use, to ask and receive of and
from George W. Coffin, Esq. of Boston, in the county of Suffolk, Land
Agent for the Commonwealth aforesaid; a deed or warrant
of a lot ~~of a lot~~ of the Bounty Lands, appropriated by the Legisla-
-ture of said Commonwealth, for the benefit of certain Officers
and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War; and also awarded her,
the said Ruth Hull, by a Resolve of said Legislature, passed on
the 4th of February, 1834; or money instead thereof, as he, my
said Attorney, may elect: and to give such acquittance or acquittances
as may be required. Hereby ratifying and confirming whatsoever
my said Attorney, may lawfully do or cause to be done in the premises.

this eighteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and thirty four.
