 of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and thirty three,

 wealth is hereby authorized to make and execute a conveyance
 by deed thereof to me for my use and to deliver the same
 to said Greenwood, who is hereby authorized and allowed
 to make in my name all due acquittances and discharges in
 my ~~name~~ receiving the same. Thery ratifying and
 confirming whatsoever my said Attorney shall lawfully
 do in and about the premises.
