Be it Known, That on this 23rd day of October 1835, satisfactory evidence has been adduced to me, that Sarah Surtice of Sidney was the Wife and is the Widow of Daniel Surtice late of Weymouth deceased.

I Sarah Sawtelle of Sidney in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine, aged 78 years Supposed years, do, upon oath declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," that I am the widow of Daniel Townsends late of Wapalloborough in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine, who died at in the Rev. Army on the about the day of year A. D. 1778

That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, Daniel Townsends did enlist as a private in the year 1777 for three years into Brown's Regiment and died while in the service in the State of New York of the Camp disorder leaving me with two small children to support the above regiment, was in the Major's line during the war of the Revolution.

I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband, Daniel Townsends was at the time of his said enlistment, an inhabitant of Wapalloborough in the the then District of Maine and that I do know that he was at the time of his decease as aforesaid, an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, residing in but died in New York aforesaid, where he had resided for a short time years before his decease. That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that neither my said late husband, nor any one claiming under him did receive, (nor have I received since his decease,) a grant of Land, or money in lieu thereof, from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve.

Sarah Sawtelle of Sidney in the County of Kennebec and State of Maine, being the same person by whom the foregoing declaration was made, do hereby constitute and appoint ROBERT C. VOSE, of AUGUSTA, in the County of Kennebec, my true and lawful Attorney, for me and in my name, to receive from the Land Agent of the State of Maine, such certificate as he may issue to me, in virtue of a Resolve of the said State, passed March 17, 1835, entitled a "Resolve in favor of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers," to the benefit of which Resolve I am entitled. And my said Attorney is hereby authorized and empowered upon the receipt of said certificate, for me and in my name, to execute such receipt or acknowledgment therefor, as I might, were I personally present.
