Know all Men by these Presents, THAT

whose name is undersigned, and seal hereunto affixed, appointed an AGENT by the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to make and execute conveyances, agreeably to resolves of said Court passed the 17th day of June 1820

and pursuant to resolves of said Court passed the fourth day of March 1828, 18th day of February 1829, and 18th day of February 1831

do give, grant, convey and confirm, and by these presents, in behalf of said Commonwealth, have given, granted, conveyed and confirmed unto Samuel Parker, formerly a Major in the Massachusetts Regiment of Artillery commanded by Colonel Grant

who enlisted as a Soldier into the American Army to serve during the revolutionary War with Great Britain, and who was returned as a part of the Massachusetts quota of said Army, and who did actually serve in said Army the full term of three years, and was honorably discharged, and to his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, and interest of said Commonwealth, in and unto a lot of land numbered Six

situate and lying in a township, in the County of Penobscot in the State of Maine, numbered two in the seventh range of townships, west of the east line of said State

said lot contains two hundred acres, bounded on the north by lot number seven, on the east by the town line, on the south by lot number five, and on the west by lot number eighteen.

according to a plan of the survey of said township made by Joseph Lo Kelley in the Autumn of the year eighteen hundred and twenty nine and will more fully appear on reference being had to said plan now on file in the Land Office.

To Have and to Hold the aforegranted premises to the said Samuel Parker his heirs and assigns, to their use and behoof forever. In TESTIMONY WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand, and affixed my seal this Twenty fifth day of February in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and thirty three

Suffolk 25th Feb^y. 1833 Then the above named George W Coffin appeared personally before me, and acknowledged the foregoing instrument by him subscribed, to be his free act and deed in his said capacity.

Be it known that on this 21st day of January 1833
1833 personally appeared before me Isaac Goodell
a Justice of the Peace in & for the County of Grafton
in the State of New Hampshire Samuel
Parkes of Syracuse in said County aged twenty
seven years a revolutionary pensioner of the United
States and being duly sworn doth on his
oath depose & say that he enlisted into the
American Army in March 1777 at Peek-
skill New York (where he was on a militia
expedition) for during the war as a private
soldier that he enlisted on the condition that
he might come home that Spring but in
the summer that he enlisted into Capt. Princt's
company of Artillery being of the Massachusetts
state troops being in the third regiment
of artillery - that on his return he was in the
battle of Brim's fight but the capture of
Burgoyne under the command of Capt. Sicut Hall
that he served as a private Major in said company
over six years until the close of the war was
honorably discharged at West Point on the
8th of June 1783 by a written discharge which
he gave to an agent (Benedy Richens) to get his
some money of pay & clothing he did he understood he
filed it in the war office - that Capt. Princt
was killed in Brim's fight but that Capt
Verbeke commended it from them until the
war closed - that he was in the battle of Monmouth
but the taking of Cornwallis & that he makes this
declaration in order to obtain the two hundred
dollars offered in the State of Maine due to him
by a law or Resolves of the Commonwealth
of Massachusetts that he hereby applies for the same

land in the State of Maine which I
am entitled to receive from the
State of Massachusetts by virtue of
the resolves of the Legislature thereof
granting lands in the State of Maine
to the Massachusetts State troops of the
Revolution and to accept receive
a deed thereof from the agent
of said State for me to my use -
