# Land Grant Application- Parks, John (Framingham)

John Parks

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Whereas it has been made Satisfactory to appear that John Park did serve as a good Soldier in the Armies of the United States of North America - the term of three years during the Revolutionary War - And is entitled to a certain grant - as per Resolves passed making grants to certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War - Said Resolves passed at the late Session of the Legislature of Massachusetts March 27<sup>th</sup> 1833 -

Now therefore I Lucy Park of Framingham County of Middlesex and State of Massachusetts - Widow of the above named John Park - do declare - am entitled to Two hundred acres of Land in either of the Counties of Somerset or Penobscot - State of Maine - according to certain Resolves passed by the Legislature of Massachusetts - March 27<sup>th</sup> 1833 - as above named.

Now be it known that I do hereby appoint - constitute and empower Stephen Perry of Boston to be my lawful Attorney - to choose or select a certain tract of Land of Two hundred acres - to which I am entitled according to the above mentioned Resolves - to cause a deed of the same to be made running to himself or any other person or persons whom he may designate.

Finally giving and granting to my said Attorney in the premises full power to do all matters acts and things in as full and ample a manner as I myself could were I personally present. allowing and holding firm and valid all and whatsoever my said Attorney shall lawfully do.
