appointed an Agent by the General Court of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, to make
and execute conveyances, agreeably to a resolve of said Court passed the 1st. day
of June 1820 —————
and pursuant to
resolves of said Court passed the 4th. day of March 1828 —————
18th day of February 1829, and 18th day of February
1831 —————

do give, grant, convey and confirm, and by these presents, in behalf of said Commonwealth,
have given, granted, conveyed and confirmed unto Samuel Pike, formerly
a corporal in the 3rd Massachusetts regiment,
commanded by Col^t McLean.

who enlisted as a Soldier into the American Army to serve during the revolutionary War
with Great Britain, and who was returned as a part of the Massachusetts quota of said
Army, and who did actually serve in said Army the full term of three years, and was hon-
orably discharged, and to his heirs and assigns, all the right, title, and interest of said
Commonwealth, in and unto a lot of land numbered 100

situate and lying in a township, in the County
of Penobscot ————— in the State of Maine, Numbered two in
the 7th range of townships west of the east
line of said State —————

said lot contains two hundred acres, bounded on the north by lot number
101, on the east by lot number 89, on the south
by lot number 99, and on the west by lot number
112 —————

according to a plan of the survey of said township made by Joseph L. Kelsey
in the month of Autumn of eighteen hundred and 29
and will more fully appear on reference being had to said plan now on file in
the Land Office.

Samuel Pike ————— his heirs and assigns, to ~~have~~ their use

until the close of the war when I was regularly discharged
from the said Regiment of the Massachusetts line
commanded by Colonel H Jackson
I further declare that I have never received a deed for
the quantity of land promised me on the part of
the State of Massachusetts or any commutation
therefore

Therefore know all men by
these presents that I Samuel Pike afformed do
hereby constitute and appoint Lucy Wakeley of
the city of Albany to be my true and lawfull attorney
for me and in my name to select from the tract
of land appropriated by the Commonwealth of Massa-
chusetts for the satisfaction of Revolutionary claims
such lot or lots of land as he shall see fit and
proper and further to receive from the land agent
a title or deed therefore ~~to be made~~
