I Edmar Warden of Wells in the County of York and State of Maine, aged sixty eight years, do, upon oath declare, in order to obtain the benefit of a Resolve of the Legislature of Maine, passed March 17. 1835, entitled a Resolve in favour of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolutionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and Soldiers, that I am the Widow of Thomas Warden late of Wells in the County of York and State of Maine, who died at Wells on the fifteenth day of February A. D. 1827. —

That I have reason to believe, and do fully believe, that my said late husband Thomas Warden did enlist in the Army of the Revolution in March A. D. 1778 for during the War in the Regiment commanded by Col. Henry Jackson and did actually serve in the Revolutionary War from the time of said enlistment untill the close of the War June 8. 1783 when he was honourably discharged at Newburgh in the State of New York, and previous to his enlistment in 1778 he had served in said Revolutionary War for several months in each of the years of 1775, 1776 & 1777. —

I do further on oath declare that I have reason to believe and do fully believe, that my said late husband Thomas Warden was at the time of his said enlistment, an inhabitant of Marblehead in the County of Essex and Commonwealth of Massachusetts and that I do know that he was at the time of his decease as aforesaid an inhabitant of the said State of Maine, residing in Wells aforesaid, where he had resided for eighteen — years before his decease. — That I have reason to believe and do fully believe, that neither my said late husband, nor any one claiming under him did receive, nor have I received since his decease, a grant of Land or Money in lieu thereof from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, for his said service, or any other service during the Revolutionary War, and that I am therefore justly entitled to the full benefit of said Resolve —

Know all Men by these Presents, That I Ednah Warden of
Wells in the County of York and State of Maine, being the
same person by whom the foregoing declaration was made,
do hereby constitute and appoint Ebenezer G. Moore of said
Wells my true and lawful attorney for me and in my name
to receive from the Land Agent of the State of Maine, such
certificate as he may issue to me, in virtue of a Resolve
of the said State, passed March 17. 1835, entitled a Resolve
in favour of certain Officers and Soldiers of the Revolu-
-tionary War, and the Widows of the deceased Officers and
Soldiers, to the benefit of which Resolve I am entitled. —
And my said attorney is hereby authorized and empower-
-ed upon the receipt of said certificate, for me and in
my name, to execute such receipt or acknowledgment
therefor, as I might, were I personally present. —

shall do by virtue hereof, — Witness my hand and seal
