Lexington April 7th 1834

To whom it may concern this may certify that the bearer Isaac Smith an Inhabitant of Lexington in the County of Middlesex enlisted in the 3^d Massachusetts Regt. under the Command of M^r. Jackson B. Genl. Said Smith was then an Inhabitant of Lexington and has ever since been an Inhabitant of Massachusetts to our personal knowledge and is the same person named in the discharge from the service which he holds signed by said Jackson Said Smith enlisted for the term of 3 years
