Plymouth p. Dec 7. 1833.

Personally appeared before me the undersigned  
Solomon Lincoln, a justice of the peace in and for said  
county of Plymouth Israel Whiton a resident of Hingham  
in said county aged seventy five years, who being duly  
sworn deposeth and saith that after rendering various  
military services to his country in the war of the Revolu-  
tion, in the Spring of the year 1777 he enlisted for  
the term of three years as a private in Capt. Solivers  
company and in Col. Henry Jacksons Regiment. He  
served the whole of said term of three years in said  
Regiment in Rhoads Island, N. York and near  
Manistown, New Jersey, near which place he was  
honorably discharged. He has no written discharge  
He further deposeth and saith that he never received any  
compensation from the State of Massachusetts by way  
of pension or bounty for said service.

Plymouth p. Dec 7. 1833. Then the above named Is-  
rael Whiton personally appeared before me the subscri-  
ber a justice of the peace for said county & made solemn  
oath that the above declaration by him subscribed  
is true. I further certify that Israel Whiton is well  
known to me as a man of good reputation for truth.

Know all men by these presents, that I  
Israel Whiton of Hingham in the County of Plymouth  
and Commonwealth of Massachusetts, Cooper, being  
entitled to the benefits of the Resolves of the General  
Court of said Commonwealth passed on the twenty  
seventh day of March last past, in consideration of  
the sum of fifty dollars to me paid by Royal  
Whitson of said Hingham, Merchant, the receipt  
whereof I do hereby acknowledge, do hereby sell, of  
sign and transfer to said Royal Whitson, his heirs  
executors, administrators and assigns all my right  
title interest and claim in and to the sum of fifty  
dollars in money or to a lot of land contain-  
ing two hundred acres as provided in the Resolves  
aforesaid for those who enlisted for and served a  
term not less than three years at one time in  
the Army of the Revolution. And I do hereby  
constitute said Royal my attorney in my name  
but to his own use to take all legal measures  
which may be proper for the recovery of the aforesaid  
premises with power of substitution. Witness my  
hand & seal this twenty fifth day of December in  
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred  
and thirty three.
