COUNTY OF PENOBSCOT, ss. at a Circuit Court of Common Pleas. began and held in at Bangor within and for said County on the fourth Tuesday of June 1820

ON this 27 day of June in the year

of our Lord eighteen hundred and twenty, personally appeared in open court, being a court of record within and for said County and State of Maine, established by a law of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, made and passed on the seventh day of June, A. D. 1811, and recognized by the Constitution of the State of Maine having power of full imper-

sonment *Jacob Hart* aged, 57 *fifty nine* years, resident in *Bangor* in said County of Penobscot, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: *In 1780 I enlisted*

and served in the Revolutionary war in the company commanded by Capt Benjamin Hayward as a private soldier in the Regiment commanded by Lieut Col Smith in the Massachusetts line on the continental establishment, and was afterwards transferred into the company commanded by Capt Adam Bailey in the Regiment under the command of Col Ebenezer Sprout and was discharged at the close of the year 1783. - All which is more particularly set forth in my original declaration made on the seventh day of April, 1818 and the depositions of Ebenezer Fisher & Isaac Blodgett on which declaration & depositions my certificate of pension Numbered 13521 was granted.

held at Bangor in and for the County of Penobscot aforesaid,
on the first Monday of January in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

On the fourth day of the sitting of said Court, personally
appeared in open Court being a Court of Record, Jacob Hatt
aged Sixty one years, resident in the town of Brewer in the
County of Penobscot aforesaid, who being first duly sworn
according to Law, doth, on his Oath declare, that he served
in the Revolutionary War as follows - That in the year 1780
he entered and served in the Company commanded by Capt. Benjamin
Haywood, as a Private Soldier, in the Regiment Commanded by Lieutenant
Col. Smith in the Massachusetts Line, on the Continental establishment
and was afterwards transferred into the Company commanded by Capt.
Adam Bailey in the Regiment under the command of Col. Ebenezer
Sproat, and was honorably discharged at the close of the year 1783 -
All which will appear Original declaration made on the twentieth
Day of April 1818, and the Depositions of Ebenezer Fisher & Isaac
Clewly, on which Declaration and Depositions he obtain a pension
Certificate No. 13,421. The same Declaration also made to the
Secretary of War on the twenty seventh day of June A.D. 1820 -
in compliance with the Act of May 1820 - and in consequence of
which he was stricken from the Pension list.

On this twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord Eighteen Hundred & Twenty^{two} personally appeared in open Court to wit in the Supreme Judicial Court holden at Bangor within & for said County the same being a Court of record which proceeds according to the Course of the Common Law with a jurisdiction unlimited in point of amount Jacob & Co. ^{in person} ~~residents~~ said County aged Sixty two years who being first duly sworn according to Law doth on his oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the provision made by the acts of the 18th March 1818 the 1st of May 1820 & the 1st of March 1823 that he the said Jacob & Co. ^{in the State of Massachusetts} enlisted for the term of three years in the year 1780 as a private in the company commanded by Capt Benjamin Haywood in the Regiment commanded by Lieut Col. Smith in the Massachusetts line on the Continental Establishment, that he was transferred to the company commanded by Capt Adam Bailey in Col Odenreich Sprouts Regiment & continued in said Service until the ~~close~~ close of the year 1783 when he was discharged from said Service at West Point in the State of New York

And I do solemnly swear that I was a resident Citizen of the United States on the 18th of March 1818 & that I have not since that time by gift sale or in any other manner disposed of my property or any part thereof with intent thereby to diminish it as to bring myself within the provision of an Act of Congress entitled an Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the Land & Naval Service of the United States during the revolutionary war & that I have passed on the 18th day of March 1818 & that I have not now had any person in trust for me any property or securities contracts or debts due to me ^{and} have I any income other than that which is retained in the schedule hereto annexed and by me submitted
