# STATE OF MAINE.

COUNTY OF PENOBCOT, ss. at a Circuit Court of Common Pleas, began and held in all  
Bangor within and for said County on the fourth Tuesday of June 1820  
ON this 22 day of June in the year

ON this day of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty, personally appeared in open court, being a court of record within and for said County and State of Maine, established by a law of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, made and passed on the <sup>thirtieth</sup> day of June, A. D. 1811, and recognized by the Constitution of the State of Maine having power of <sup>full, impuni-</sup>  
~~onment~~ Jacob Hark aged, <sup>seventy</sup> ~~fifty nine~~ years, resident in Brewer  
in said County of Penobscot, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, declare that he served in the Revolutionary war as follows: In 1780 I enlisted  
and served in the Revolutionary war in the company commanded by Capt Benjamin Haywood as a private  
soldier in the Regiment commanded by Lieut Col Smith  
in the ~~at~~ <sup>across</sup> the line on the continental establishment  
and was afterwards transferred into the company commanded by Capt Adam Bailey in the Regiment  
under the command of Col Ebenezer Sprunt and  
was discharged at the close of the year 1783. - All which  
is more particularly set forth in my original declaration made on the seventh day of April 1818 and  
the depositions of Ebenezer Fisher & Isaac Blawley on  
which declaration & depositions my certificate of pension  
Numbered 13521 was granted.

Penobscot ss. At a Circuit Court of Common Pleas, begun and held at Bangor in and for the County of Penobscot aforesaid, on the first Monday of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

On the fourth day of the sitting of said Court, personally appeared in open Court being a Court of Record, Jacob Hart, aged Sixty one years, resident in the Town of Brewer in the County of Penobscot aforesaid, who being first duly sworn according to Law, doth, on his Oath declare, that he served in the Revolutionary War as follows - That in the year 1780 he enlisted and served in the Company commanded by Capt. Benjamin Haywood, as a Private Soldier, in the Regiment Commanded by Lieutenant Col. Smith in the Massachusetts Line, on the Continental establishment and was afterward transferred into the Company commanded by Capt. Adam Bailey in the Regiment under the command of Col. Ebenezer Grant, and was honorably discharged at the close of the year 1783 - All which will appear original declaration made on the twentieth Day of April 1818, and the Depositions of Ebenezer Fisher & Isaac Clewley, on which Declaration and Depositions he obtain a pension Certificate No. 13, 421. The same Declaration also made to the Secretary of War on the twenty eighth day of June A.D. 1820 - in compliance with the Act of May 1820 - and in consequence of which his name was struck from the Pension list.

On this twentieth day of June in the year  
of our Lord Eighteen Hundred & Twenty <sup>thirteen</sup> personally  
appeared in open court to wit in the Supreme judicial  
Court Holden at Bangor within & for said County the  
same being a Court of record which proceeds according  
to the usage of the common law with a jurisdiction  
unlimited in point of amount Jacob Hatch <sup>in manner</sup> resident  
Said County aged Sixty two years who being first duly  
sworn according to law doth on his oath make the following  
declaration in order to obtain the provision  
made by the acts of the 18<sup>th</sup> March 1818 the 1<sup>st</sup> of May  
1820 & the 1<sup>st</sup> of March 1823 that he the said Jacob  
<sup>in the year of Massachusetts</sup>  
Hatch enlisted for the term of three years in the year  
1780 as a private <sup>soldier</sup> in the company commanded by Capt  
Benjamin Haywood in the Regiments commanded by Lieut  
Col. Smith in the Massachusetts line on the continental  
Establishment, that he was transferred to the Company  
commanded by Capt Adam Bailey in Col Ebenezer  
Sprouts Regiment & continued in said Service  
until the close of the year 1783 when he was discharged  
from Said Service at West Point in the State of New York.

And I do solemnly swear that I
