Certificate of Discharge.

A hereby Certify, That Asa C. Howe of Lovell Maine, a Rivat of Captain David Ripley's Company of Fifteener in the Detachment commanded by Col. Orison Figology of the drasted Militia of Maine, was born in Semmark in the State of Maine is aged 20 years 5 feet and 5 inches high, Larks complexion, clark eyes, dark hair, and by profession, when called into actual service by the State of Maine for the protection of its Northeastern Frontier, a Farm
He was called into actual service by order of the Governor of Maine, and rendezvoused at Augusta Maine, on the Siyth day of March A. D. 1839, being drafted from Captain Parnes Malker's Company of Regiment, second Brigade, and state Division of the Militia of Maine, and then residing at Levell in said State; and having faithfully and honestly served the period required, is now entitled to an honorable discharge.
The above named Cloa C. He has monthly pay due him from the Scyth day of Preach 1839, when last to include this day; and he is also entitled to pay and subsistence for travel from his residence to the place of rendezvous, and from the place of discharge to his home, being 160 miles, and whatever other allowances are authorized by law, to soldiers so discharged. He is also entitled to pay for clothing during the period of his service: or he has drawn the following articles of clothing, to wit:
the pro rata excess, if any, to be deducted, or the deficiency, if any, to be paid for.
GIVEN in triplicate, at Paris Maine, this first day of Newvernber A. D. 1839.
Juril R. Riflez Captain or Commanding Officer of said Company.

One of these Certificates is to be lodged in the Office of the Adjutant General, at Augusta, and two are to be delivered to the Paymaster.
